A PROCLAMATION.

To the Legislative Councillors of the Dominion of New Zealand, and the Members elected to serve in the House of Representatives of the said Dominion, summoned and called to a Meeting of the General Assembly of the said Dominion, at the City of Wellington, on the twenty-sixth day of the month of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, to have been commenced and held, and to every of you: Greeting.

WHEREAS the Meeting of the General Assembly stands prorogued to the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one: And whereas for certain causes and considerations, I have thought fit to convene such meeting for a date earlier than the said date: Now, therefore, know ye that you and each of you, and all others in this behalf interested, are hereby commanded and by the tenor of these presents enjoined to be and appear personally for the Despatch of Business, on Wednesday, the eleventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, at half past two o'clock in the afternoon, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Bowen Street, in the City of Wellington, there to take into consideration the state and welfare of the said Dominion of New Zealand and therein to do as may seem necessary.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, and issued under the Seal of that Dominion, this 13th day of February, 1931.
