HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made under the Land Drainage Act, 1908, dated the eighteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, the area described in the Schedule to the said Order in Council was constituted a drainage district under the said Act, to be called the Huntress Creek Drainage District:
