Prohibition of Issue of Money-orders and Transmission of Postal Correspondence in New Zealand in connection with Royal Prince Alfred Hospital's No. 3 Art Union, Sydney.

THE Postmaster-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, having reasonable ground for supposing that the organization and person whose names and addresses are shown in the Schedule hereunder are engaged in promoting or carrying-out a lottery or scheme of chance, it is hereby ordered, under section 32 of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, that no money-order in favour of the said organization or person shall be issued, and that no postal packet addressed to

the said organization or person (either by its or his own or any fictitious or assumed name) or addressed to the second address in the Schedule hereunder without a name, shall be either registered or forwarded by the Post Office of New Zealand.
