COPY OF A RESOLUTION PASSED AT A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE ST. KILDA BOROUGH COUNCIL, HELD ON MONDAY, 29TH JUNE, 1931, AT 7.50 P.M.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the St. Kilda Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

“That, for the purpose of providing the interest and sinking fund on a loan of six thousand eight hundred pounds (£6,800), authorized to be raised by the St. Kilda Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of paying off a special loan of nine thousand nine hundred pounds (£9,900) maturing on the first day of August, 1931, the balance of that loan—namely, three thousand one hundred pounds (£3,100) having been otherwise provided, the said St. Kilda Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of three-eighths of one penny (¾d.) in the pound (£1) upon the rateable value of all rateable property in the Borough of St. Kilda, comprising the whole of the said borough, and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable half-yearly on the first day of February and the first day of August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-two (22) years, or until the loan is fully paid off.”
