Revoking the Reservation over Portion of a Scenic Reserve in the North Auckland Land District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is a reserve duly set apart for scenic purposes: And whereas the said land is no longer suitable for scenic purposes by reason of the absence of scenic features thereon: Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section eight of the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910, do hereby revoke the reservation for scenic purposes over the land described in the Schedule hereto.

A minimum charge not exceeding 9s. 6d. per month, including meter rent (if any) may be collected from each consumer if required by the licensee, and shall be printed on the licensee’s conditions of supply.”

And whereas it is expedient to revoke such regulations and to make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the said Order in Council of the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, in so far as it relates to "Householder" circulars, and the said Order in Council of the sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth declare that the said revocation shall take effect and that the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

"HOUSEHOLDER" CIRCULARS.

CIRCULARS or other printed matter and samples, whether enclosed in covers or not, either unaddressed or addressed merely by designation to a class of persons to whom delivery is to be made, such as "The Householder" (with or without a place of delivery), may be prepaid in cash to the number of not less than 240 at the rate for each postal packet of ½d. for each two ounces or fraction thereof. In cases in which 250,000 or more "Householder" circulars are posted by one sender within a period not exceeding twelve months, the postage rate for each circular shall be ¾d. for each two ounces or fraction thereof: Provided that if the posting is spread over such a period postage shall be paid at the rate for each

circular of ½d. for each two ounces until 187,500 circulars have been posted; and thereafter further circulars not exceeding 62,500 in number shall be accepted postage free if posted within twelve months after the date of the initial posting:

Provided the circulars bear the inscription "Postage Paid," the special permit required under the "Prepayment of postage in cash system" shall not require to be obtained for "Householder" circulars.

Circulars posted in accordance with these regulations but not delivered may be recovered by the person or firm posting them.

Regulations for the Regulating of the Import and Export of Coined Silver.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section twelve of the Finance Act, 1931 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said section.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as "The Coined Silver Regulations, 1931."

2. These regulations shall come into force on the date of publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

3. In these regulations—

"Minister" means the Minister of Finance:

"Value" in the case of a coin which is legal currency in New Zealand or which purports to be of the same denomination as that of a coin which is legal currency in New Zealand, means "face value."

4. No person shall import or attempt to import into New Zealand, or export or attempt to export from New Zealand, any coined silver otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.

5. It shall be lawful for any person arriving in New Zealand to bring with him into New Zealand on such arrival any amount of coined silver not exceeding in value £2 or such larger sum as the Minister may permit.

6. It shall be lawful for any person leaving New Zealand to take with him on his departure from New Zealand an amount of coined silver not exceeding £5 or such larger sum as the Minister may permit.

7. It shall be lawful for any person leaving New Zealand with the intention of proceeding to Great Britain or Ireland by direct route, without transshipment from the vessel in which he leaves New Zealand, to take with him an amount of coined silver not exceeding £10 or such larger sum as the Minister may permit.

8. The Minister may grant permission for the exportation of worn or mutilated coined silver which is or has been legal tender and is intended to be returned to the Royal mint.

9. The Minister may grant permission for the importation of supplies of new coined silver struck at the Royal mint for the purpose of increasing or replenishing the currency of the Dominion.

10. Any permission given by the Minister under the foregoing provisions of these regulations shall be in writing under the hand of the Minister, and may relate to any particular transaction or to any class of transactions therein described, and may be given subject to such conditions or restrictions as the Minister in his discretion thinks fit.

11. The Minister may in any special case by writing under his hand authorize the exportation or importation of coined silver subject to such conditions or restrictions as the Minister in his discretion thinks fit.

12. These regulations shall not apply to the importation or exportation of any coined silver, whether legal tender or not, which is more than one hundred years old, or any coined silver, whether legal tender or not, which is of a kind not in circulation in New Zealand.

13. Every person who imports or attempts to import into New Zealand or exports or attempts to export from New Zealand any coined silver contrary to the provisions of these regulations commits a breach of these regulations.

HIS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

SHORT TITLE.

1. THIS Order may be cited as the Samoa Notaries Order, 1931.

APPOINTMENT OF NOTARIES PUBLIC.

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor-General by Letters Patent under his hand and the Seal of New Zealand, in the form set out in the First Schedule hereto, from time to time, for the due convenience and accommodation of the public, to appoint fit persons to be Notaries Public in the Territory of Western Samoa.

RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF NOTARIES PUBLIC.

3. Any person so appointed shall enjoy the like rights and privileges and be liable to discharge the same duties as Notaries Public are by custom, law, and usage wont to enjoy and discharge in New Zealand.

APPOINTMENT WITHIN SAMOA ONLY.

4. No such appointment shall authorize the holder thereof to practise as a Notary in any place outside the Territory of Western Samoa.

APPLICATION FOR APPOINTMENT.

5. No such appointment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Administrator of Western Samoa, and upon the written application of the person seeking appointment supported by at least one Notary Public (whether practising in Western Samoa or elsewhere) within or outside the British Dominions, and upon satisfactory evidence of the character, integrity, ability, and competency of the applicant.

OATH.

6. No such Letters Patent shall be delivered to the applicant until he has taken before the Administrator an oath of office in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto, or made before the Administrator an affirmation in lieu of oath to the like effect, and until the Administrator has endorsed the Letters Patent with a statement signed by him that such oath has been taken or affirmation made, and the name of the Notary entered on the Roll of Notaries accordingly.

FEES.

7. No such Letters Patent shall be issued until the applicant has paid to the Samoan Treasury a fee of £15 15s.

ROLL.

8. The Administrator shall cause a Roll of Notaries to be kept and entry to be made therein of the name of every person to whom Letters Patent have been granted under this Order, the date of such Letters, the date of the delivery thereof, and the date of the death of every such person or other cause of his ceasing to be a Notary.

EVIDENCE OF APPOINTMENT.

9. A certificate under the hand of the Administrator shall be conclusive evidence of the fact that any person is or is not a Notary, or of an entry in the said roll or of the absence of an entry therein, as the case may require.

MISCONDUCT.

10. On the application of the Attorney-General the High Court may direct that the name of a Notary be struck off the Roll of Notaries for misconduct as a Notary or in any other professional capacity, or for fraud in his application, or for other good cause shown, and every person so struck off shall thenceforth for ever be wholly disabled from practising as a Notary or performing or certifying any notarial act.

OFFENCE.

11. Any person who in his own name or in the name of any other person makes, does, acts, exercises, or executes or performs any act, matter, or thing, of or in any wise appertaining or belonging to the office, function, or practice of a Notary Public for or in expectation of any gain, fee, or reward without being able to prove, if required, that he is duly authorized to do so is liable to a fine of £50.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the thirtieth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and published in the *Gazette* of the second day of the following month, at page 3028, William Henry Jackman, Farmer, of Whakapirau, Henry Edward Fitzgerald McMurdo, Farmer, of Marohemo, and Thomas Henry Hanna, Farmer, of Whakapirau, as trustees for the settlers of the district, were licensed to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Whakapirau, Kaipara Harbour, as shown on plans M.D. 2719 and 2721, deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to maintain thereon a building (hereinafter called the “said structure”), for a period of fourteen years from the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen:

And whereas the said license has expired, and Guy Henry Jackman, Robert Heatley, and Charles Edward Upton, as trustees for the settlers of the district (hereinafter called “the licensees” in which term is to be construed, unless the con-

text requires a different construction, their executors, administrators, and assigns), have made application for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called “the said Act”), for a further term of fourteen years, computed from the expiry of the term of the last-mentioned license, and it is expedient to grant the same for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent, as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said structure is erected, as shown on plans M.D. 2719 and 2721, so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said structure in accordance with the said plans; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

“Foreshore” means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

“Low-water mark” means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

“Minister” means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said structure, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2719 and 2721, so deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensees shall pay to the Minister the sum of £1, and thereafter an annual rent of 10s., in advance, payable on the first day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such annual rental in respect of the period from the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, to the thirty-first day of March following, to be paid on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said structure, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service, in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of, the said structure without payment.

6. The licensees shall maintain the said structure in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensees' own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said structure, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such structure, requiring the licensees, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensees shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed, or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for the term of fourteen years, computed from the 1st day of August, 1931, unless, in the meantime, such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

11. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the structure may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the licensees.

12. In case the licensees shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said structure for a period of thirty days;
- (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions—

then, and in any such case, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, right, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

13. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensees shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said structure entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the licensees fail so to do, the Minister may cause the said structure to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensees.
