A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, as amended by section ten of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, it is enacted that on the disposal of any national-endowment land by way of sale, or on the acquisition of the fee-simple of any such land, the Governor-General may by Proclamation declare that such land shall, as from a date to be specified in the Proclamation, cease to be national-endowment land:

And whereas the fee-simple of the lands described in the Schedule hereto (being lands heretofore held under the tenures specified in the said Schedule) has been acquired, and it is expedient that the said lands should cease to be national-endowment lands:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the aforesaid section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the dates specified in the Schedule hereto the lands described in the said Schedule which were set apart as national-endowment lands under the provisions of section two hundred and fifty-eight of the Land Act, 1908, ceased to be national-endowment lands.

- On the next £1,750 or any less sum: £6½ per cent.;
- On all further sums: £3½ per cent.;

Provided that where the bankrupt's business is carried on by the Assignee, the commission shall be calculated on the gross receipts of such business.

In the case of partnerships, commission shall be payable in respect of the partnership estate computed apart from the separate estates of the bankrupts.

Deputy Assignee's Remuneration.

Remuneration pursuant to section 21 of the above-mentioned Act shall be paid out of the Assignee's commission to Deputy Assignees who are not members of the Public Service as follows:—

- On the first amount of £250 or any less sum realized by the Deputy Assignee, calculated as above: £10 per cent. with a minimum of £3 3s.;
- On the next £1,750 or any less sum: £5 per cent.;
- On all further sums: £2½ per cent.;

Provided that the minimum remuneration of £3 3s. above mentioned shall be payable to the Deputy Assignee notwithstanding that the assets in the estate may be insufficient to produce such an amount as commission.

A "Danish seine net" is a net having a wing on each side of the cod-end or bag, with a warp attached to each wing, and which is operated by being drawn over the sea bottom or through the sea, the power for hauling in the net to the vessel being provided by a winch driven by an internal-combustion or steam engine. Such hauling operations shall be carried out only while the vessel is moored or anchored and not under way.

"Trawling" or "using a trawl net" means drawing a net over the sea bottom, or through the sea by means of one or more vessels under way.

2. Pilotage is compulsory.

HARBOURMASTER'S FEES.

3. For removing vessels from one place to another within the harbour the Harbourmaster's fees shall be ½d. per ton for steamers and 1d. per ton for sailing vessels: Provided that any vessel which engages the service of a pilot and pays pilotage shall be exempt from Harbourmaster's fees.

PORT CHARGE.

4. On every vessel over twenty tons net register, whether coming from seaward or not and whether propelled by steam or not, navigating or plying, whether for hire or not, there shall be payable a port charge of 1d. per ton on arrival: Provided that the maximum amount chargeable under this by-law shall not exceed one shilling per ton in any half-year in respect of each vessel.

GENERAL.

5. For the purposes of these by-laws tonnage shall be deemed to be the net registered tonnage of the ship as specified in her Certificate of Registry, with the addition of such amount of tonnage as may, pursuant to the provisions of section 63 of the Harbours Act, 1923, be added to the ship's registered tonnage.

License authorizing the New Plymouth Borough Council to erect Electric Lines in the Borough of Waitara and Portions of the Taranaki and Inglewood Counties.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the New Plymouth Borough Council to lay, construct, put up, place, and use electric-lines within the areas of supply described in the Schedule hereto on the terms and conditions following.

CONDITIONS.

1. PURPOSES OF LINES.

The said lines may be used for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

2. LICENSES TO BE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

The license hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the regulations made under section 2 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, on the 11th day of July, 1927, and published in the *Gazette* on the 12th day of the same month at page 2360 (hereinafter called "the said regulations"), and with all regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof.

3. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be the system described in paragraphs (a) and (e) of clause 5 of the said regulations. The voltage of transmission shall be 11,000 volts.

4. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 4d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes: Provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes. The wholesale charge for bulk supply shall not exceed £12 per kilowatt of maximum demand per annum. For the purposes of this license "bulk" supply shall be defined as one for which a consumer guarantees to pay not less than £120 per annum.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license, unless sooner determined, whether by surrender of the license or by revocation under the provisions contained in the said regulations, shall continue in force until the 19th July, 1962, provided that in so far as it authorizes the erection of electric lines within the Borough of Waitara, this license may be revoked by the Governor-General in Council at any time after the 9th December, 1932, unless in the meantime the licensee has secured a contract to supply the freezing-works at Waitara, belonging to Messrs. Borthwick and Sons (Australasia), Ltd., with the major portion of its electrical demand for such period and within such time as the Minister may consider reasonable.

6. PURCHASE OF INSTALLATION BY ELECTRIC-POWER BOARD.

Subject to the provisions of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, or any Act passed in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof, and provided the licensee shall have legal power to comply with the requirements of this clause, any Electric-power Board duly constituted in terms of the aforesaid Acts, if its district or outer area shall include the area of supply herebefore described, shall have the right at any time during the currency of this license after the 9th December, 1942, to purchase and take over the licensee's installation in the said area of supply, at a valuation to be agreed upon between the Board and the licensee, and failing such agreement, at a valuation to be fixed by a single arbitrator to be appointed pursuant to the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1908, and thereupon the Governor-General may by Order in Council revoke this license.

7. EFFECT OF DETERMINATION OF LICENSE.

The determination of this license, whether by expiration of time, by surrender, or by revocation as aforesaid, shall not relieve the licensee from any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

8. RAILWAY AND TELEGRAPH LINES.

The licensee shall, from time to time, rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Railways and Minister of Telegraphs respectively any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of any telegraph-line which is under the control of or in use by the Railway Department and the Post and Telegraph Department respectively, and which was erected before the erection of the lines hereby licensed.

9. REQUIREMENTS OF WAITARA BOROUGH COUNCIL, TARANAKI ELECTRIC-POWER BOARD, AND TARANAKI AND INGLEWOOD COUNTY COUNCILS.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not by virtue of these presents be entitled to lay, construct, put up, place, or use the electric lines hereby authorized except in conformity with the agreement dated 15th July, 1930, made between the New Plymouth Borough Council and Waitara Borough Council; and also, subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this

license or of the said regulations, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof, as may from time to time lawfully be imposed by the Waitara Borough Council, Taranaki Electric-power Board, and Taranaki and Inglewood County Councils.

10. ROUTES RESERVED FOR GOVERNMENT LINES.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Herbert Tate and Charles Hodge, trading under the style or title of the Miranda Lime Works (hereinafter called "the licensees," in which term is to be construed, unless the context requires a different construction, their executors, administrators, and assigns), have applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto at Miranda, in the Frith of Thames, as shown on plan marked M.D. 6983, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf, swinging-basin, piling, and entrance channel (hereinafter referred to as "the said works"):

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the said works will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the licensees on the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and

of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, which is particularly shown and delineated on plan marked M.D. 6983, so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting, constructing, and maintaining such wharf, swinging-basin, piling, and entrance channel thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

“Foreshore” means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

“Low-water mark” means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

“Minister” means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any other officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection or construction of the said works as shown on the plan marked M.D. 6983, deposited as aforesaid, in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensees shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £26, in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st March following to be paid on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said works without payment.

5. All persons shall, at all reasonable times and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom, and all vessels shall have full liberty, without charge, to navigate in that part of the channel from the entrance thereof to its junction with the channel leading to the public wharf at Miranda.

6. The licensees shall maintain the said works in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at their own cost suitable and necessary lights on the wharf, at the entrance to the channel, and at the junction of the channel with that leading to the public wharf at Miranda, for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said works, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such works, requiring the licensees within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensees shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be carried out, as the case may be.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen days from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority, and the licensees shall not assign,

charge, or part with any such rights, powers, or privileges without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said works may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the licensees.

13. In case the licensees shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinafter set forth, or any of them; or

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf or other works for a period of thirty days; or

(3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or

(4) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy;

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of any Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council and the license, rights, and privileges thereby conferred have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensees shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said works entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be, and if the licensees fail so to do, the Minister may cause the said works to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensees.

15. The licensees shall execute a bond in such form and for such amount as may be approved by the Minister as a guarantee of the due performance by them of the duties imposed upon them by clause 14 hereof.

16. The construction of the said works or any of them shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensees of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the nineteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and the twentieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, at page 333, the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, at page 1679, and the thirteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, at page 6, respectively, Glass Murray, Rapata Hotorene, Hemi Manuera, Henry Norman, and Alan Munro were licensed, as trustees for the inhabitants of the district, to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Te Hapua, Parengarenga, as a site for a wharf, to be erected in accordance with plan marked M.D. 4352, deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for a period of fourteen years from the nineteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and dues and rates were prescribed for the use of the said wharf:

And whereas the said license has expired, and it is desirable to grant a license to Rata Murupaenga, Glass Murray, and Gordon Rust, all of Te Hapua, Kenneth Richardson, of Te Pahi, and Alexander Hume Watt, of Te Kao (hereinafter

called "the licensees"), who, as trustees for the inhabitants of the district, have made application for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a further term of fourteen years, computed from the expiry of the term of the said last-mentioned license, and it is expedient to grant the same for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the wharf and shed in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set out in the First Schedule hereto, and doth prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken by the licensees for the use of the said wharf and shed.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the wharf and shed as shown on the plan marked M.D. 4352, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensees shall pay to the Minister an annual sum of 1s., payable on demand.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf and shed and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf and shed without payment.

6. The licensees shall maintain the said wharf and shed in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the licensees' own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and shed and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf and shed, requiring the licensees within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensees shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf and shed shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for the term of fourteen years, computed from the 19th day of January, 1929, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which any structure on the said premises may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the licensees.

13. In case the licensees shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf and shed for a period of thirty days;

then, and in either such case, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, right, and privileges thereby granted and conferred have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensees shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf and shed entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the licensees fail so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf and shed to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensees.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

SHIPPING WHARFAGE.

For every vessel a sum of 1d. per ton on the gross tonnage of such vessel per day for each day or part of a day a vessel shall occupy a berth at the said wharf, or alongside any vessel lying at the said wharf, or shall lie at the said wharf undergoing repairs or fitting-out only, or shall lie off the said wharf with a line attached thereto.

GOODS WHARFAGE.

1. For all goods landed on or shipped from the said wharf a rate of 2s. 6d. per ton weight or measurement, at the option of the licensees, minimum charge, 6d.

2. For every head of cattle or horses landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, 2s. 6d. per head.

3. For every yearling or calf landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, 1s. per head.

4. For every head of sheep or small cattle landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, 6d. per head.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section five of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and the amendments thereof, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes aforesaid.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall haul or use a Danish-seine net for the purpose of taking fish within the undermentioned waters—that is to say, within Aotea Harbour and those waters of the sea confined within the arc of a circle having a radius of one and a half nautical miles from Kahua Point, and as the said area is delineated on plan marked M.D. 6980; within Kawhia Harbour and those waters of the sea confined within the arc of a circle having a radius of one and a half nautical miles from Urawitiki Point, Southern Head, at the entrance to Kawhia Harbour, as the said area is delineated on plan marked M.D. 6980; within Raglan Harbour and those waters of the sea confined within the arc of a circle having a radius of one and a half nautical miles from Rangitoto Point, Northern Head, at the entrance to Raglan Harbour, as such area is delineated on plan marked M.D. 6981.
