Increasing Borrowing Powers of Napier Fire Board.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty-one of the Brigades Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor-General in Council may, on the application of any Fire Board established under the said Act, extend the powers of that Board to borrow moneys in excess of the limits fixed by the said section:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and published in the *Gazette* on the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, at pages 334 and 335, the powers of the Napier Fire Board to borrow moneys were extended, but so as not to exceed the sum of twenty thousand pounds:

And whereas application has been made by the said Napier Fire Board for further extension of borrowing powers, and it is desirable to grant such application:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby extend the powers of the said Board to borrow moneys in excess of the limits fixed by the said section thirty-one, and doth hereby declare that the powers vested in the said Board by the said section thirty-one may be exercised so that the total amount of money so borrowed and for the time being unpaid may exceed the sum of ten thousand pounds, but so, nevertheless, that save in the case of a loan raised for the purpose of paying off a previous loan, the powers vested in the said Board by the said section thirty-one shall not be so exercised that the total amount of money so borrowed and for the time being unpaid exceeds at any time the sum of thirty-five thousand pounds:

Provided that no moneys shall be borrowed under the authority hereby conferred except subject to the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas, in respect of such of the said loans as are intended to be borrowed at a rate of interest not otherwise authorized, the Minister of Finance has in each case given his precedent consent as required by section one hundred and fourteen of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, to the borrowing by the said local authorities of the respective loans aforesaid, for the terms set out in the Fifth Column of the said Schedule, at respective rates of interest being such as shall not produce to the lenders rates exceeding the respective rates specified in the Sixth Column of the said Schedule:

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Rotorua Trout-fishing Regulations Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and form part of the principal regulations.

2. Regulation 36 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted in lieu thereof:—

36. (1) No person shall in fishing for trout in any place to which this regulation applies use—

- (i) Any lure or bait other than an artificial fly;
- (ii) Any spinning fly, or fly with an spinning attachment, whether such fly be an artificial fly or not;
- (iii) Any artificial fly in the manner known as “trolling” or “harling.”

(2) This regulation shall apply to the following places:—

- (a) The Kaituna River between Lake Rototiti and the electric-power station at the Okere Falls,

- (b) The Tahana-atara Stream.
- (c) Every part of Lake Rotoiti lying within 200 yds. of that portion of the lake shore which commences at a point 300 yds. north of the Tapuaeharuru Stream, and extends thence in a southerly and westerly direction to a point 300 yds. north-north-west of Haupara Stream.
- (d) Every stream, spring, and river flowing into or from that part of Lake Rotoiti described in paragraph (c) hereof.
- (e) The Ohau Channel.
- (f) Every stream, spring, and river flowing into or from the lakes and portion of a lake hereinafter mentioned, and the waters of such lake lying within a radius of 300 yds. shore to shore from the centre of the meeting-line of every such stream, spring, or river and the lake into or from which it flows.
- The lakes and portion of a lake referred to in this paragraph are:—
- (i) Lake Rotorua.
 - (ii) That portion of Lake Rotoiti not comprised in the area described in paragraph (c) hereof.
 - (iii) Lake Rotoehu.
 - (iv) Lake Rotoma.
 - (v) Lake Rotokakahi.
 - (vi) Lake Tarawera.
- (g) The Waikaretakeke River.
- (h) The Hopuruahe, Mokau, and Aniwaniwa Rivers, and the waters of Lake Waikaremoana within a radius of 300 yds. shore to shore from the respective centres of the meeting-line of each of the said rivers and the said lake.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 5th day of October, 1931.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and the seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, at page 3679, and the fifteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, at page 1628, respectively, the management of the wharf at Pigeon Bay, as shown on plans marked M.D. 927 and 928, deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, was, in pursuance of the provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), vested in the Pigeon Bay Road Board (hereinafter called "the Board," in which term is to be construed, unless the context required a different construction, its successors or assigns), and dues and rates were prescribed to be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf :

And whereas the hereinbefore-recited Orders in Council have expired, and the Board has applied to have the management of the said wharf vested in the Board for a further term, and it is desirable to grant the same :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the said wharf in the Board, subject to the conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken by the Board for the use of the said wharf.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. IN these conditions the terms—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides :

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides :

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said wharf, at the site shown on the plans marked M.D. 927 and 928.

3. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

5. The Board shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections on or in connection with the wharf, in good order and repair; and shall, at all times, exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the Board's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

6. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the Board shall be applied to keeping such wharf, and all erections on or in connection with such wharf, in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister, may at all reasonable times, enter upon the above-mentioned wharf, and any buildings erected thereon or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the Board

in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Board, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Board shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The Board shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf, any buildings or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The Board shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf, and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account, when balanced, to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

11. The Board shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the said wharf.

12. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue to be in force for a period of fourteen years, computed from the 24th day of September, 1931, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Board shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Board in New Zealand.

15. The Board shall be liable for any injury which may be caused by the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Board.

16. In case the Board shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days—

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Board or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Board and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the licenses, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

17. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Board shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Board fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, any may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Board.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

WHARFAGE DUES.

EVERY person who shall use the said wharf for landing or shipping sheep or cattle shall, before using the same, pay dues as follows, that is to say,—

1. For every head of sheep so landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, the sum of 1d. per head.

2. For every head of cattle landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, 1s. per head.

Department of Internal Affairs,
Wellington, 1st October, 1931.

THE following by-laws, made by the Port Chalmers Fire Board, are published in accordance with the Fire Brigades Act, 1926.

ADAM HAMILTON, Minister of Internal Affairs.

PORT CHALMERS FIRE BOARD BY-LAWS.

By virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it in that behalf by section 60 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1926, the Port Chalmers Fire Board hereby makes the following by-laws.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSES.

In these by-laws, except where inconsistent with the context or when otherwise expressly provided,—

“Board” means the Port Chalmers Fire Board constituted under the provisions of the Act;

“Brigade” means the Port Chalmers Fire Brigade established and enrolled under the provisions of these by-laws;

“Corps” means the Port Chalmers Fire Police and Salvage Corps established and enrolled under the provisions of these by-laws;

“District” means the Port Chalmers Fire District as defined in *New Zealand Gazette* of the 5th day of November, 1918;

“Secretary” means the Secretary appointed by the Port Chalmers Fire Board;

“Superintendent” and “Deputy Superintendent” mean respectively the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent of the Port Chalmers Fire Brigade appointed by the Port Chalmers Fire Board;

“Street” means any public or private street or road, and includes public places;

“The Act” means the Fire Brigades Act, 1926, and any amendment thereof.

ESTABLISHMENT.

1. The brigade shall consist of Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent, and not less than twelve firemen, and such number of auxiliaries as the Board may from time to time determine.

ENROLMENT OF MEMBERS.

2. Candidates for enrolment as members of the brigade must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing, or sight. They must be not less than twenty-one years of age nor more than thirty-two years, unless they have been previously and recently engaged as active and efficient

firemen or are otherwise thoroughly competent. In such cases the limit may be extended to forty years. They must be able to read and write, and may be required to produce testimonials as to character and ability. They may also be required to produce certificate of birth or other satisfactory proof of age. They will be required to undergo a medical examination by such legally qualified medical practitioner as the Board may appoint. Members of the brigade acting in that capacity on the coming into force of this by-law to be exempt from these requirements.

APPLICATION FOR ENROLMENT.

3. Applications for enrolment must be made in form set out in Schedule A to these by-laws, and applicants shall only be enrolled as members of the brigade on their application being approved by the Board.

MEMBERS TO SERVE TERM OF PROBATION.

4. Candidates when approved will be accepted as members of the brigade on probation only, the term of which shall be three months. If at the end of such term the probationer shall have given satisfaction to the Superintendent, and have proved himself suitable, his acceptance as an enrolled member may be confirmed by the Board.

PERIOD OF SERVICE.

5. Members of the brigade are subject to the provisions of clause 4 hereof, enrolled for service from year to year, subject to three months' notice in writing on either side, except as hereinafter provided.

APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION OF OFFICERS.

6. The appointment of the Superintendent shall be made by the Board. The appointment of the Deputy Superintendent shall be made by the Board, due consideration being given to the recommendation of the Superintendent, either by the engagement of men not heretofore in the service of the Board or by promotion of officers or men in the Board's service.

RETIRING-AGE.

7. The age at which members must retire from the brigade shall be as follows: Superintendent or Deputy Superintendent, sixty-five years; firemen, fifty years; but the Board may, if it thinks fit, in any special cases extend these limits for a further five years, but no more.

CARE OF UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT.

8. Uniforms and equipment of pattern and design approved by the Board will be issued to members of the brigade on enrolment, but shall remain the property of the Board; and each member of the brigade on resigning from or otherwise leaving the brigade shall return all articles on issue to him clean and in good order and condition, fair wear and tear only excepted, and in the event of his failing so to do the value of the articles not returned or returned in a damaged condition shall be deemed a debt due to the Board by the member of the brigade and may be recovered by process of law.

THE SUPERINTENDENT.

9. The duties and powers of the Superintendent, in addition to those conferred by the Act, shall be as follows:—

- (1) He shall be responsible to the Board for the efficiency of the members of the brigade, and all gear used in its service.
- (2) He shall have the power to suspend any member for breach of discipline or misconduct of any description at any time, but must at once report such suspension to the Board. The member suspended may appeal to the Board, who will hold an inquiry into the alleged breach of discipline or misconduct. At such inquiry the suspended member may be present and have the right to speak in his defence, and, if he desires, bring witnesses in support of same.
- (3) He shall keep an order-book, in which from time to time all orders affecting the working of the brigade shall be entered. Such order-book, or a copy of the orders therein, shall be available for inspection by members of the brigade at all times.
- (4) He shall allot such duties to the members of the brigade as he shall deem necessary for insuring the efficiency thereof, and may withdraw any member from any special duty and allot him fresh duties at his (the Superintendent's) discretion.
- (5) He shall keep a store-book, in which shall be entered all property of the Fire Board, the date of purchase, and the date it was used or condemned.

- (6) He shall keep the service-record book, containing the names, occupations, places of birth, dates of birth, dates of joining and discharge from the brigade.
- (7) He shall keep in a book provided for that purpose a roll of the members of the brigade, and enter or cause to be entered therein, the attendance of each member at all drills, practices, fires, and false alarms, and the reason for the absence of any member.
- (8) He shall keep a record in such form as may be approved by the Board, of all fire-calls received by the brigade.
- (9) He shall, at the end of every quarter, make a written report to the Board as to the water pressure, the state of the brigade equipment, the behaviour of the members of the brigade, the number of drills held and fire-calls occurring during the quarter, and the attendance of brigade members thereat, and such other matter as the Board may from time to time direct. If he desires to make any request to the Board, or submit any matters for consideration, he shall do so by means of a signed memorandum attached to the report.
- (10) He shall perform any further duty in connection with his position which the Fire Board may from time to time assign to him.

DISCIPLINE.

10. A member of the brigade guilty of any of the following offences whilst on the premises of the Board, or going to, present at, or returning from any drill practice, false alarm, or fire shall be liable to suspension from duty by the Superintendent:—

- (a) Being in an intoxicated condition;
- (b) Disobeying any lawful order of his superior officer;
- (c) Using abusive or insubordinate language to his superior officer;
- (d) Striking his superior officer;
- (e) Using obscene language.

A member of the brigade committing either of the following offences shall be reported to the Board by the Superintendent:—

- (a) Wilfully damaging any portion of the Brigade premises or other property of the Board;
- (b) Absenting himself without sufficient excuse from any drill or practice ordered by the Superintendent, or from any false alarm or fire.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

11. (a) Leave of absence for any period not exceeding fourteen days may, on the application of any member of the brigade, be granted by the Superintendent, who shall record same in his occurrence-book.

(b) Any member of the brigade desiring leave of absence for a longer period than fourteen days shall apply in writing addressed to the Superintendent, who shall forward such application to the Secretary of the Board with such recommendation as he may think fit, and leave of absence for such longer period shall only be granted by the Board.

(c) Change of Address.—It shall be the duty of any member changing his address to notify the Secretary of such change.

BRIGADE MAY MAKE RULES.

12. Subject to the approval of the Board, and provided they in no way conflict with any provision of these by-laws, the brigade may make rules and regulations for its own government.

BRIGADE PREMISES NOT TO BE ABUSED.

13. Betting or gambling shall not be permitted on any part of the brigade premises, nor shall any noisy recreation be indulged in therein or thereabout, and no property other than that of the brigade shall be brought into or left on the premises.

MEMBERS TO SALUTE SUPERINTENDENT AND DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT.

14. Firemen shall at all times salute the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent when addressing or being addressed by them whilst on duty.

PURCHASE OF STORES OR EFFECTING OF REPAIRS TO BE SANCTIONED BY BOARD.

15. Stores required for use of the brigade, and repairs required to any of the premises or gear, shall only be obtained or carried out by direction of the Board on requisition signed by the Superintendent. Neither the Superintendent nor other officer for the time being in control of the brigade shall have any authority to purchase on behalf of the Board nor to in any way pledge the Board's credit for repairs or material.

MEMBERS OF BRIGADE NOT TO WRITE TO THE PRESS ON FIRE-BRIGADE MATTERS.

16. No member of the brigade shall under any circumstances write any letters or furnish information to the press on matters connected with the Board or brigade, save that the Superintendent or Deputy Superintendent or, in the event of no such superior officer being present, the senior on duty may give particulars regarding any fire which has been attended.

FIRE POLICE AND SALVAGE CORPS.

17. The members of the force established by the Board under the authority of section 62 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1926, for the purpose of attending at fires and saving properties shall be enrolled by the Secretary as a fire police and salvage corps. The control of such corps shall vest in and be exercised by the officer elected to be captain by the members and approved by the Board. The duty of such fire police shall be to attend at any fire to aid and assist the regular Police Force, to watch over any properties saved, to preserve order, and carry out any instruction which may be given by the Superintendent or Deputy Superintendent or such other officer of the fire brigade in command on the spot. Such instructions to be conveyed as far as possible through the captain or officer in charge of the fire police.

GRATUITIES FOR VOLUNTEER OR OTHER SERVICES.

18. For the performance of any volunteer or special services rendered by any person, whether a member of any brigade or not, in respect of any fire there may be paid out of the funds of the Board such sum as the Board or any committee authorized by the Board may direct.

ELECTRIC FIRE-ALARM CIRCUITS.

19. The Board may establish or contract with any person or corporation for the establishment of an electric fire-alarm circuit, or may take over any such circuit now or hereafter established by the Port Chalmers Borough Council, and may from time to time extend such circuit and provide for the connection therewith of street alarms and public and private buildings and premises. All connections of alarms installed in public or private buildings or premises, and alterations to the same shall be carried out to the approval of the Board at the cost of the owner of the property to be connected, and the cost of maintenance and of the periodical examination and testing of such connections shall be borne by the owner of the property connected, and all such connections shall be efficiently maintained to the satisfaction of the Board or the officer appointed by the Board for that purpose. With the consent of the owner such cost may be commuted to the payment of such annual sum as may be agreed on between the Board and the owner.

IN RESPECT OF FIRES ON BOARD ANY SHIP OR VESSEL.

20. If any brigade or any portion of any brigade established and maintained by the Board attends and performs any services at a fire taking place on board any ship or vessel, then the owner of such ship or vessel shall pay to the Board for such attendance and service the undermentioned rates as fixed by the Board not exceeding:—

Superintendent or officer in charge of brigade: First hour, £1 1s.; each succeeding hour, 10s. 6d.
Each fireman: First hour, 5s.; each succeeding hour 2s. 6d.
Each fire appliance, £2 10s.

The said charges to be reckoned as from the time the brigade leaves the station until it returns to the station.

IN RESPECT OF THE MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AND THE INSURING OF GOOD CONDUCT ON THE PART OF THE OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE BRIGADE.

21. No person shall interfere with or obstruct any officer or member of a brigade in the execution of his duty.

22. No person shall aid, abet, or encourage any member of a brigade in any act of disobedience of orders, or insubordination, or in the use of abusive or obscene language while such member is on duty.

23. No person shall supply any intoxicating liquors to any officer or member of a brigade while such officer or member shall be on duty, unless he shall first have received from the officer in charge of the brigade at the time permission to do so.

24. No person other than the members of the Fire Board and its Secretary, or members of a brigade, shall enter any station unless they shall first have received permission to do so from the officer in charge.

25. No person shall sleep in or on any station or in or on any of the Board's premises without the written permission of the Superintendent.

26. No intoxicants shall be brought into any station without the special written permission of the Superintendent, which is not to be granted except under exceptional circumstances.

27. For the purposes of the preceding paragraphs of this part numbered 21, 22, and 23 the words "officer or member of a brigade" shall be deemed to include officer or member of a volunteer fire brigade or volunteer fire police.

PENALTY CLAUSE.

28. Every person guilty of an offence against or committing any breach of or failing to perform any duty imposed upon him by any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be liable for such offence, breach, or failure to such a fine, not exceeding £20, as the Court inflicting the same shall in its discretion think fit.

The foregoing by-laws were made by the Port Chalmers Fire Board at a duly constituted meeting of the said Board held on the 10th day of September, 1931.

NOTE.—The weather during the month was seasonable, but the average mean temperature was below normal. Precipitation was 42 per cent. below the average, and it was the driest August since 1915. Total bright sunshine, 134.7 hours, 41 per cent. of the possible, and four sunless days. Frost was recorded on the grass on six mornings. A few flakes of snow were seen on the 4th. Hail fell on the 4th and 12th, lightning was seen on the 9th, and fog was in evidence on four days. Mean dew-point at 9 hrs., 41.5°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.261 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1931.

General.—There were several brief periods of stormy weather during August, but, on the whole, there was a considerable improvement in conditions over those of the two preceding winter months. Temperatures were again below normal over the greater part of the Dominion. Cold frosty nights were frequent but, on the other hand, many mild spring-like days were experienced and, as a result, there was a moderate growth of pasture. Stock have kept in fair condition, although a considerable amount of supplementary feeding had to be resorted to in parts of the East Coast districts, where the growth of grass had been retarded through a deficiency of rain combined with below-normal winter temperatures.

Rainfall.—The total rain for the month was below the average over the greater portion of the North Island, a slight excess only being recorded in parts of the Taranaki district. In the South Island, Marlborough and North Canterbury experienced less than the normal, while the remaining districts nearly all had above-normal aggregates, the excess in many cases being considerable.

The storms recorded during the month were in very few cases responsible for any particularly heavy rains except at a few isolated places, chiefly in western districts, the falls generally being more of a showery nature.

Pressure Systems.—During the first four days a very intense and extensive westerly depression was situated over and to the east of New Zealand, and stormy west to south-west winds prevailed, which in some districts developed almost hurricane force at times. They were accompanied by occasional heavy showers and, in places, hail. Snow also fell during this period on much of the high country, and on the 4th there was quite a heavy fall of snow in Central Hawke's Bay. Much damage resulted from this storm in various parts of the country. At Ohai, in Southland, the roofs of several houses were lifted, some chimneys were blown down, and trees uprooted.

From the 5th to the 11th, except for some scattered showers, the weather was mainly fine under the influence of an anti-cyclone which moved gradually across the Dominion. On the 11th, however, barometers commenced to fall with the approach of a steep westerly depression, and on the 12th a widespread north-west gale blew and heavy rain fell in the western districts. The nor'-wester was an extremely fierce one in Canterbury, causing damage to telegraph wires through falling trees. In Christchurch many sheds were unroofed and fences blown down.

The next important disturbance was again one of the westerly type, but it developed a centre in its southern portion, the latter crossing the southern districts during the night of the 16th. Beneficial rain set in with the southerly change on

the night of the 16th in Canterbury and Otago, and continued throughout the 17th. Although the falls were not heavy they relieved the situation in these districts where the land was showing the detrimental effect of the continued dry weather and strong westerly winds.

Another depression, but of moderate intensity, which crossed over the country between the 23rd and 26th, brought rain of a scattered nature. Some heavy falls, however, occurred in Westland about this time, but very little fell in Canterbury, and practically none in Hawke's Bay. On the afternoon of the 24th, while the low centre connected with this disturbance was situated off the west coast of Otago, a waterspout passed in the vicinity of Westport.

During the last three days of the month the weather was affected by an extensive double-centred cyclone. The first centre passed in the south on the night of the 29th, while the following one moved up the west coast and eventually crossed the northern districts during the night of the 31st. Unsettled, dull, misty weather was associated with this depression, and rain fell at times in nearly all parts of the Dominion.

In addition to the depressions already mentioned, there were three occasions when cyclones moved down from the north-east and passed to the east of East Cape. Their nearest approach to the latter point occurred on the 15th, 22nd, and 28th respectively, and their effects were confined chiefly to the East Cape and Gisborne areas. About these dates strong southerly winds blew in these districts, but unfortunately the accompanying rains were only light and scattered along the east coast of the North Island, where relatively dry conditions persisted throughout the month.
