WHEREAS the Pukekohe Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") proposes to raise, pursuant to the terms of a Warrant issued under section one hundred and thirty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, the sum of one thousand one hundred and seventy-five pounds by a loan to be known as "Tuakau Bridge Loan, 1931," for the purpose of meeting its share of the cost of constructing a bridge (together with approaches thereto) over the Waikato River, at Tuakau, on the Pukekohe – Glen Murray via Tuakau Main Highway:

The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account, when balanced, to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

11. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the said wharf.

Classification of Assistant Teachers in Technical Schools and of Manual-training Teachers.

THE following lists of assistant teachers employed in technical schools, combined schools, and recognized technical classes, and recognized manual-training classes, or classified for employment in such schools or classes, are issued under the authority of the Minister of Education, in accordance with the regulations relating to technical schools, recognized technical classes, recognized manual-training classes, and combined secondary and technical schools, made by Orders in Council dated the 20th November, 1925, and 25th September,

Under the heading "Division" is shown the division and

Under the heading "Division" is shown the division and class in which the teacher is classified.

The class of salary corresponding with the class and division in which the teacher is placed is given in the Schedule to the aforementioned regulations.

Attention is drawn to the regulations relating to appeals of teachers against their classification and grading, under which any teacher who considers he has good grounds for which the property of the selection may lodge an appeal to reach which any teacher who considers he has good grounds for objection to his classification may lodge an appeal to reach the Director of Education not later than forty clear days after the publication of this list in the New Zealand Gazette—i.e., such appeals must reach the Director not later than the 19th January, 1932, and must contain an explicit statement of the grounds on which the appeal is based.

Note.—In the last column of the classification list T.S. stands for "Technical School," E.B. for "Education Board," S. of A. for "School of Art," J.H.S. for "Junior High School," and C.S. for "Combined School."
