BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Forests Act, 1921-22, and pursuant to a resolution in that behalf passed by both Houses of Parliament, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke (so far only as it relates to the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto) the Proclamation of the twenty-third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and five, whereby the said land (with certain other land) was set apart as a permanent State forest, and declare that the reservation thereby effected is (so far only as aforesaid) revoked accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1924, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Jackson's Bay, Kuaotunu, Manaia, Okarito, Mercury Bay, and Whangarei Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Okarito, Mercury Bay, and Whangarei Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be continuous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of the Marriage Act, 1908.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Forests Act, 1921-22, and pursuant to a resolution in that behalf passed by both Houses of Parliament, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke (so far only as it relates to the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto) the Proclamation of the twenty-eighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, whereby the said land (with certain other land) was set apart as a permanent State forest, and declare that the reservation thereby effected is (so far as aforesaid) reserved accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Jackson's Bay, Kuaotunu, Manaia, Okarito, Mercury Bay, and Whangarei districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

OKARITO DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Westland Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Wanganui River; thence up the middle of that river to its source, and by a right line to the summit of the Southern Alps; thence by a line along the summit of the Southern Alps to Mt. Aspiring; thence by a right line running in the direction of the mouth of the Awarua River in Big Bay to a point due north of Cosmos Peak; thence by a right line to Cosmos Peak; thence by the eastern watershed of the Hollyford River to Mt. Anau; thence towards the south generally by the summit of the range over McKinnon's Pass to Castle Mountain; thence by a right line to Bligh Sound at Cloudy Pass; thence towards the west and north-west generally by the sea to the mouth of the Wanganui River, the place of commencement.

MERCURY BAY DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, bounded on the north and east by the sea from the mouth of the Opononui Stream to the northern head of Tairua Harbour; thence by a right line to the source of the Waikawhau Stream; thence to and along the summit of the dividing range to Castle Rock (Trig. No. 24); thence by a right line to the source of the Opononui Stream, and by that stream to its mouth, the point of commencement.

WHANGAREI DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, bounded by a line commencing at a point in the Hikurangi River where it is intersected by a line drawn from Te Tarahi-o-Rahiri Trig.-station to the north-eastern corner of Section 23, Block IX, Hukerenui Survey District; thence by the middle of the said river to the south-western corner of Block IV, Mangakahia Survey District; thence by the southern boundary of the said Block IV to the road at the north-western corner of Section 4, Block VIII, Mangakahia Survey

District; thence by the road forming the south-western boundaries of Sections 4, 3, 2, and 1, Block VIII aforesaid, and the road forming the southern boundaries of Sections 14, 13, 12, 11, 10, and 5, Block II, Purua Survey District, to the Wairua River; thence by that river to the north-eastern boundary of Ruatangata Parish; thence by the said north-eastern boundary of that parish to the northernmost corner of Section 19, Block VII, Purua Survey District; thence by Section 20, the north-western boundaries of Maketawa and Maungarei Blocks, and the northern boundaries of the last-mentioned block and Ngamutu Block to Section 22, Block V, Purua Survey District; thence by the northern boundary of that section, across a railway and road, and by the road forming the north-western boundary of Section 37, Block V aforesaid; thence by the road forming the north-eastern boundary of that section and the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 83, 84, and 85, Block VII, Purua Survey District, to the southernmost corner of Section 40 (Education Reserve); thence by the said Section 40 to the Mangakino Stream; across that stream and by Museum Endowment and Kopua-toetoe Block to the Ngunguru River; thence by that river to the sea; thence by the sea to Whangarei Harbour; thence by the northern shore of Whangarei Harbour to Parua Bay; thence along a right line to One Tree Point; thence by the northern shores of the said Whangarei Harbour to the south-eastern corner of the Maungapere Parish; thence by the Maungakaramea Parish to the Whangarei-Mangapai Road; thence by that road, passing through Sections 98, 99, 101, 132, 102, and 103, and the road passing Sections 86, 79, 78, 77, 76, 75, 73, 65, 64, 63, and 62 to the road forming the eastern boundaries generally of Sections 127, 126, and 125, Maungakaramea Parish; thence by that road to the north-eastern corner of Section 125 aforesaid; thence by the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of Maungakaramea Parish to the north-eastern corner of Section 7A, Block I, Tangihua Survey District; thence along the road forming the northern boundaries of Sections 7A, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15, Block I, Tangihua Survey District, through Puke-pukerau Block, and passing Sections 8 and 10, Block IV, Maungaru Survey District, to the intersection of the said road by a right line running from Trig.-station No. 41, Tangihua, to Trig.-station No. 18, Te Tarahi-o-Rahiri; thence towards the south-west by the said right line to Trig.-station 18 aforesaid; thence by a right line in the direction of the north-eastern corner of Section 23, Block IX, Hukerenui Survey District, to the Hikurangi River, the point of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the 25th day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the locality known as "White Hills," in the County of Waitemata, shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Pine Valley," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such locality accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and published in the *Gazette* of the seventh day of that month, the control of the land described in the Schedule to that document, being a reserve for the protection of gannets, was vested in certain persons therein named, who were by the said Order in Council constituted a special Board, by the name of the Cape Kidnapper Bird Sanctuary Board, in pursuance of section two of the Public Reserves and Domains Amendment Act, 1914 :

And whereas the period for which control was vested as aforesaid has been extended to the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three :

And whereas it is considered desirable that the membership of the said Board should be increased :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section seventeen of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby appoint

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and eighty-six of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called the said Act), it is enacted that the Governor-General in Council may vest the management of any wharf, the property of His Majesty the King, in any person upon such terms and conditions as the Governor-General in Council thinks fit:

And whereas it is thought advisable to vest in Charles John Johnston, Fisherman, Leonard Wilson, Fisherman, James Heath, Fisherman, all of Karitane, as Trustees for the inhabitants of the district (hereinafter referred to as “the Trustees”), the management of the jetty and shed which are erected on the foreshore at Karitane, Waikouaiti River, and which are shown on plan marked M.D. 2593, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the said jetty and shed in the Trustees, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. In these conditions the terms—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of the tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said jetty and shed at the site shown on the plan marked M.D. 2593.

3. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned jetty and shed, and all rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said jetty and shed without payment.

5. The Trustees shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned jetty and shed and all erections on or in connection with the jetty and shed in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the Trustees' own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

6. All dues and rates received on account of the said jetty and shed by the Trustees shall be applied to keeping such jetty and shed and all erections on or in connection with such jetty and shed, in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the above-mentioned jetty and shed and any buildings erected thereon or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the Trustees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such jetty and shed or buildings, requiring the Trustees, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Trustees shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said jetty shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The Trustees shall not erect or suffer to be erected on the said jetty and shed any buildings or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The Trustees shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such jetty and shed, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account, when balanced, to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

11. The Trustees shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the said jetty and shed.

12. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Trustees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Trustees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving the Trustees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Trustees in New Zealand.

15. The Trustees shall be liable for any injury which may be caused by the said jetty and shed to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Trustees.

16. In case the Trustees shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said jetty and shed for a period of thirty consecutive days;

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Trustees or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Trustees and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the licenses, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred have been revoked and determined.

17. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Trustees shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said jetty and shed entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Trustees fail so to do, the Minister may cause the said jetty and shed to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Trustees.

By-laws regulating Traffic on the Taupo - National Park Main Highway.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Main Highways Act, 1922 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), the powers, rights, duties, and liabilities vested in or imposed on the Governor-General or the Minister of Public Works (in the case of Government roads) are, in the case of main highways, transferred to and vested in or imposed on the Main Highways Board:

And whereas by subsection (5) of section 33 of the Finance Act, 1924, it is provided that any by-laws in force in respect of any public highway immediately prior to its constitution as a main highway under the said Act shall continue in force as if made by the Main Highways Board in respect of that main highway unless and until they are revoked or superseded pursuant to powers conferred by the said Act:

And whereas by Order in Council made on the 2nd day of April, 1928, and published in the *Gazette* on the 5th day of the same month, at page 929, the road from Taupo to National Park was declared to be a main highway (hereinafter referred to as "the said main highway"):

And whereas in pursuance of the authority conferred by section 139 of the Public Works Act, 1908, and section 4 of the Motor Regulation Act, 1908, the Minister of Public Works, on the 27th day of May, 1924, made by-laws in respect of the Waimarino-Tokaanu Road (being part of the said main highway) which were published in the *Gazette* on the 29th day of the same month, at page 1322, regulating traffic on the said road and the said by-laws are still in force and enure under the provisions of the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, and the Public Works Act, 1928:

Now, therefore, the Main Highways Board, in pursuance of the authority conferred by section 9 of the said Act, the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, the Public Works Act, 1928, and all other powers in anywise enabling it in this behalf, doth hereby revoke the said by-laws, and doth hereby make the following by-laws in respect of the Taupo - National Park Main Highway, and doth hereby declare that such revocation shall take effect, and the by-laws hereby made shall come into force on the 1st day of April, 1932.

BY-LAWS.

1. Interpretation.

- (1) IN these by-laws, where not inconsistent with the context,—
- "Engineer" means the Engineer of the Public Works Department for the time being a member of the District Highways Council of the No. 6 Highway District:
 - "Gross weight" means the weight of any traction-engine, motor-lorry, machine, or other vehicle, together with any persons and any thing or things being transported thereon:
 - "To operate" means to use or drive or to cause or suffer to be used or driven or to permit to be upon the said main highway:
 - "Wet weather" means any time when rain, hail, snow, or sleet is falling:
 - "Authorized person" means and includes "Engineer" as hereinbefore defined, or any Traffic Inspector, Overseer, or surfaceman in charge of the said main highway or any part thereof.
 - "Heavy traffic" has the meaning given to that term by section 155 of the Public Works Act, 1928.
- (2) These by-laws may be cited as "The Taupo - National Park Main Highway Traffic By-laws, 1932."

2. Prohibition of Traffic.

(1) During the whole or any part of the months of May, June, July, August, and September no person shall, on the Taupo - National Park Main Highway during wet weather or within twelve hours thereafter, operate any vehicle, engine, or machine engaged in heavy traffic of any kind whatsoever if the gross weight thereof exceeds 3 tons.

(2) The weight of loading or contents of any vehicle may for the purposes of these by-laws be computed from the cubical or superficial measurements of such loading or contents, and for this purpose the

quantities hereunder set out shall, so far as regards the material or articles mentioned respectively, represent one ton and so on proportionately:—

New Zealand timber	..	400 superficial feet.
Australian timber	..	350 superficial feet.
Firewood or fencing posts	..	$\frac{1}{2}$ cord or 64 cubic feet.
Sand	..	21 cubic feet.
Cement	..	5 barrels (or bags equal to same).
Broken stone	..	21 cubic feet.
Lime	..	38 cubic feet.
Bricks	..	320.
Coal	..	45 cubic feet.
Chaff	..	25 bags.
Oats	..	(4-bushel bags) 10 bags.
Wool	..	5 bales.
Iron and steel	..	$4\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet.

(3) If at any time the Engineer, or any Traffic Inspector duly appointed by the Main Highways Board, is satisfied that the use of traction-engines, motor-lorries, motor-cars, or other vehicles on the said main highway or any part thereof would be attended with risk of damage to such main highway or part thereof, or danger to the public, he may by notice erected on such main highway or part thereof prohibit the use of traction-engines, motor-lorries, motor-cars, or other vehicles across or along such main highway or part thereof.

(4) No person shall operate any vehicle of a kind or class the use of which is prohibited by such notice across or along such main highway or part thereof while such notice remains in force.

(5) No person shall damage, disfigure, destroy, or remove any notice or part thereof erected in pursuance of these by-laws.

3. Damage.

The driver or any person in charge of any vehicle shall give immediate notice to the Engineer, Traffic Inspector, Overseer, or surfaceman in charge of the said main highway or any part thereof of any damage done by such vehicle to such main highway, or any part thereof, or any notice erected in pursuance of these by-laws.

4. Sledging.

No person shall draw or trail any sledge, timber, or other material in or upon the said main highway or part thereof.

5. Unloading.

No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited on any part of the said main highway the load or any portion thereof of any vehicle.

6. Chains.

No person shall operate, upon any portion of the said main highway, any vehicle fitted with a chain or chains on any wheel thereof.

7. Information to be supplied.

The driver of any vehicle shall supply on demand by any authorized person such information as to load or contents thereof and the quantity, weight, size, or measurement of the same, and shall do such acts as may be required by such authorized person for the purpose of enabling such information to be ascertained.

8. Penalties.

(1) Every person who does, or causes or procures to be done, anything contrary to or otherwise than is provided by these by-laws or any provision thereof, or who omits to do anything therein required to be done by him, shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) Every person guilty of an offence against these by-laws shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.
