5. The Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned landing-place and all erections on or in connection with the

landing-place and all erections on or in connection with the landing-place in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the Council's own cost,

suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels:

Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it
has been approved by the Minister.

6. All dues and rates received on account of the said landingplace by the Council shall be applied to keeping such landing

place, and all crections on or in connection with such landing-place, in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the above-mentioned landing-place, and any buildings erected thereon or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such landing-place or buildings requiring the Council, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such

12. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent
