*Special Order made by the Vincent County Council declaring Sections 121 and 131, Counties Act, 1920, not to apply to that Council.*

THE following special order made by the Vincent County Council is published in accordance with the provisions of the Counties Amendment Act, 1931.

In the matter of the Counties Act, 1920, and the Counties Amendment Act, 1931, and in the matter of the Corporation of the Chairman, Councillors, and Inhabitants of the County of Vincent.

Special Order passed at a Special Meeting of the Vincent County Council held at Clyde on the twenty-fifth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and confirmed at a Meeting held on the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in and conferred upon it by section two of the Counties Amendment Act, 1931, and of every and any other Act, power, and authority in this behalf it hereunto enabling, the Vincent County Council hereby resolves by way of special order and declares as follows:—

*Prohibition of Issue of Money-orders and Transmission of Postal Correspondence in New Zealand for J. Baum, Ebenholz-Vaduz, via Buchs, St. Gallen, Switzerland.*
