Apportioning the Cost of Maintenance, &c., of Portion of Mangaonua Stream, County of Waikato.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section sixty-five of the Land Drainage Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Commission was appointed and an inquiry was duly held with a view to determining what local authority could most conveniently and efficiently control that portion of the Mangaonua Stream lying between Platt's Bridge on the Matangi-Tauwhare Road and the Hoeka Bridge (hereinafter referred to as "the said portion of the Mangaonua Stream"), and what proportion of the cost of managing, maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said portion of the Mangaonua Stream should be paid by any, and, if so, which local authority or local authorities: And whereas such Commission did report to the Governor-General, after due inquiry, its opinion as to the matters respecting which it was appointed to report: And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. That the said portion of the Mangaonua Stream shall be under the exclusive care, control, management, and maintenance of the Waikato County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the County Council").

2. I fix and determine that the cost of managing, maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said portion of the Mangaonua Stream shall be provided and paid by the County Council, the Eureka Drainage Board, and the Fencourt Drainage Board as follows:—

(a) The cost of improving and reconstructing the said portion of the Mangaonua Stream in accordance with the plan prepared by the Engineer to the County Council and attached to the report of the said Commission shall be provided and paid by the County Council and the Eureka Drainage Board in equal proportions.

(b) The annual cost of managing, maintaining, and repairing the said portion of the Mangaonua Stream after the completion of the work of improvement and reconstruction hereinbefore referred to shall be provided and paid by the County Council, the Eureka Drainage Board, and the Fencourt Drainage Board in equal proportions.

3. I direct that any payment hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Eureka Drainage Board or the Fencourt Drainage Board shall be paid from time to time, in the proportions hereinbefore fixed and determined, out of the funds under the control of the Drainage Board, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the County Council; and any such payment shall be made from time to time to the County Clerk of the County Council, for and on account of such County Council.

4. And I further direct that the costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the inquiry by the Commission aforesaid touching and concerning the premises shall be paid and borne by the County Council.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensees are hereby authorized, subject to the conditions herein contained, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the said plan:—

- (a) Headworks consisting of dam and necessary intakes:
- (b) Pipe-line leading from head-race to the power-house hereinafter referred to; also tail-race from the power house to the said stream.

5. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

The licensees shall maintain the works used under this license in proper working-order during the continuance of such license.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of twenty-one years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensees shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensees of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

7. RENTAL.

The licensees shall in respect of this license pay to the District Engineer, Public Works Department, Greymouth, a yearly rental of 4s. per kilowatt of maximum output generated during each and every year from 1st March, 1931. The output either shall be recorded by means of a watt-hour meter installed by the licensees, or, failing such installation, it shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed.

8. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensees a license to take water from any portion of the said stream, except at the place where the licensees are by this license empowered to take it: Provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensees are by this license authorized to take from the said stream.

9. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensees, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

10. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensees may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon remove from the ground (if so required by the Minister) all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensees fail or neglect so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment of compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

11. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (c) of clause 5 of the regulations.

The generating and transmission voltage shall be approximately 110 volts between the terminals.

12. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to impose any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensees of the authority hereby granted; but the licensees shall be liable, for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensees of any of the powers granted by this license.

13. BED OF STREAM NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the bed of the stream shown on the said plan nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this license.

14. DEFAULT.

If the licensees fail or neglect to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clauses 229 and 230 of the regulations shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

15. ALTERATIONS TO WORKS.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations under the said Act made on the fourteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations, and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Regulations, 1932.

2. (1) Except as provided in subclause (2) hereof, every insurance company willing to undertake insurance business in terms of the said Act shall give to the Registrar of Motor-vehicles at Wellington, in the manner prescribed by section 4 of that Act, a notice in the form numbered 1 in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Every notice heretofore given by an insurance company under the regulations hereby revoked, and subsisting at the commencement of these regulations, shall continue in force until revoked in the manner prescribed by section 4 of the said Act.

3. The nomination, pursuant to section 5 of the said Act, of the insurance company with which the contract of insurance in respect of any motor-vehicle is to be made shall be in the form numbered 2 in the First Schedule hereto.

4. (1) The notice of the sale or other disposal of a motor-vehicle, required to be given pursuant to section 7 of the said Act, shall be given to the insurance company concerned by the former owner in the form numbered 3 in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Every person who, being required by section 7 of the said Act to give any such notice as aforesaid, fails to give such notice in accordance with the said section shall be liable to a fine of £5.

5. (1) The annual premiums payable in respect of contracts of insurance under the said Act for the year commencing on the 1st day of June, 1932, or for the year commencing on the same day in any subsequent year, shall be as set out in Part I of the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) When a contract of insurance in respect of any motor-vehicle is entered into for a period of less than a year the amount of the premium as prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto shall be reduced by the one-twelfth part thereof for every complete month by which the term of the contract is less than one year.

(3) Any premiums hereafter becoming payable for any period expiring before the 1st day of June, 1932, shall be fixed in accordance with the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Regulations, 1930, and the Second Schedule thereto, as if these regulations had not been revoked.

6. If any motor-vehicle (other than a motor-cycle or a motor-vehicle used exclusively as a mourning-coach) belongs to Class 8 or to Class 9 of the classes specified in the Second Schedule to these regulations, and also belongs to any other of those classes, the premium payable in respect of that vehicle shall be the premium prescribed in respect of Class 8 or of Class 9, as the case may be.

7. Where the premium payable in respect of any motor-vehicle is fixed by reference to its seating-accommodation the following rule shall be applied to determine the number of seats in any case where a division between individual seats is not clearly marked, namely:—

Every complete 16 in. of the length of an undivided seat shall be deemed to be a separate seat, and a length of seating-space less than 16 in. shall not be deemed to be a seat.

8. Where, pursuant to section 15 of the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, the registration of any motor-vehicle is cancelled on the ground that the vehicle has been destroyed, or has become permanently useless as a motor-vehicle, or has been permanently removed from New Zealand, and at the time of such cancellation there is in force in respect of the motor-vehicle a contract of insurance under the said Act, the insurance company with which such contract of insurance has been effected shall, on application in writing made by the owner of the motor-vehicle, and on being satisfied that the registration of the motor-vehicle has been cancelled as aforesaid, refund to the owner a sum equal to the one-twelfth part of the prescribed premium for every complete month between the date of the happening of the event which led to the cancellation of registration and the end of the term of the contract of insurance.

9. From every premium paid in respect of any contract of insurance under the said Act, the sum of sixpence shall be deducted for administration expenses in accordance with the provisions of subsection (2) of section 15 thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations shall form part of and be read together with the regulations made by Order in Council on the 2nd day of March, 1931, and published in the *Gazette* on the 5th day of the same month, at page 449 (hereinafter referred to as the Telephone Regulations of 1931), and shall also form part of and be read together with the regulations therein mentioned, of which it is thereby declared that the Telephone Regulations of 1931 shall form part.

2. These regulations shall come into force on the date of publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

3. The Telephone Regulations of 1931 are hereby amended by inserting, after Regulation 14 thereof, the following additional regulation:—

“14A. (1) Individual subscribers to the Lower Hutt Automatic Telephone Exchange may, in addition to enjoying the ordinary local service, be permitted to communicate direct with subscribers to the Wellington Telephone Exchange system at the rates hereinafter prescribed.

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Order in Council, and to prescribe an amended scale of fees for such inspections:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by section twenty-nine of the Inspection of Machinery Act, 1928, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the said Order in Council, and doth hereby make the following regulations prescribing the fees payable in respect of the inspections of machinery and boilers; and doth hereby further order and declare that the said regulation shall come into force on the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

REGULATION.

THE fees payable in respect of the inspections of machinery or boilers shall be in accordance with those prescribed in the Schedule hereto.

BY-LAW.

ON the application of the master or agent of any overseas vessel taking on board bunker coal and in addition a quantity of cargo coal for transport beyond New Zealand, the ordinary charges for pilotage and berthage as set out in By-laws Nos. 33 and 52 may be suspended, and half pilotage and berthage rates may be charged as provided in By-laws Nos. 33 and 52 for ships calling for bunker coal only, and, in addition, 1s. per ton on such cargo coal. The application is to be made in writing and lodged at the Westport Harbour Office not later than twenty-four hours after the departure of the vessel from the port.

Cancelling the Reservation over a Primary-education Endowment in the North Auckland Land District, and reserving Crown Land in lieu thereof.

Vesting the Control of a Scenic Reserve in the Pelorus Bridge Scenic Board.

BLEDISLOE, Governor-General.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto (being land reserved under the said Act) for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

The Commissioner of Crown Lands, Blenheim, *ex officio*,
The Mayor of Blenheim, *ex officio*,
The Mayor of Nelson, *ex officio*,
The Chairman, Marlborough County Council, *ex officio*,
The President, Marlborough Automobile Association, *ex officio*,
The President, Nelson Automobile Association, *ex officio*,
Mark Walton Grace,
Charles William Jeffries-Bryant, and
Alfred de Tracy Gould,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Pelorus Bridge Scenic Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Monday, the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, at two o'clock p.m., in the Lands and Survey Office, Blenheim, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the third Monday in each quarter at the time and place aforesaid, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.

2. The Commissioner of Crown Lands shall be the Chairman of the Board. He may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any five members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman for such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board may, with the approval of the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation, make such rules as it deems necessary for the good conduct of the public frequenting the reserve, and may set apart areas for camping-grounds or other purposes, and may fix reasonable charges for the use thereof in accordance with a scale to be approved from time to time by the Minister.

9. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

10. The Board shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

CONVENTION.

CONVENTION BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY IN RESPECT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM, AND HIS MAJESTY THE KING OF NORWAY, REGARDING LEGAL PROCEEDINGS IN CIVIL AND COMMERCIAL MATTERS.

London, January 30, 1931.

[Ratifications exchanged at London, August 7, 1931.]

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Majesty the King of Norway, being desirous to render mutual assistance in the conduct of legal proceedings, in their respective territories, in civil and commercial matters which are being dealt with or which may possibly be dealt with by their respective judicial authorities, have resolved to conclude a Convention for this purpose and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India: For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

The Rt. Hon. Arthur Henderson, M.P., His Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and

His Majesty the King of Norway:

Monsieur Benjamin Vogt, His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in London,

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

I.—PRELIMINARY.

ARTICLE 1.

(a) This Convention applies only to civil and commercial matters, including non-contentious matters.

(b) In this Convention the words "territory of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party" shall be interpreted as meaning at any time any of the territories of such High Contracting Party to which the Convention at that time applies.

II.—SERVICE OF JUDICIAL AND EXTRA-JUDICIAL DOCUMENTS.

ARTICLE 2.

When judicial or extra-judicial documents drawn up in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties are required to be served on persons, partnerships, companies, societies, or other corporations in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such documents may be served on the recipient, whatever his nationality, in the manner provided in Article 3.

ARTICLE 3.

(a) A request for service shall be addressed by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the documents to be served emanate to the competent authority of the country where the documents are to be served requesting such authority to cause the documents to be served. The request shall be sent by such Diplomatic or Consular Officer to such authority.

(b) The request for service shall be drawn up in the language of the country where service is to be effected.

The request for service shall state the full names and descriptions of the parties, the full names, address, and description of the recipient, and the nature of the document to be served, and shall enclose the documents to be served in duplicate.

(c) The document to be served shall either be drawn up in the language of the country in which it is to be served, or be accompanied by a translation in such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document emanates, or by a sworn translator of one of the two countries concerned.

(d) Requests for service shall be addressed and sent,—

In Norway to the Tribunal of First Instance in the jurisdiction of which service is to be effected;

In England to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature;

If the authority to whom a request for service has been sent is not competent to execute it, such authority shall of his own motion transmit the document to the competent authority of his own country.

(e) Service shall be effected by the competent authority of the country where the document is to be served, who shall serve the document in the manner prescribed by the municipal law of such country for the service of similar documents, except that, if a wish for some special manner of service is expressed in the request for service, such manner of service shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of that country.

(f) The execution of the request for service duly made in accordance with the preceding provisions of this Article shall not be refused unless (1) the authenticity of the request for service is not established, or (2) the High Contracting Party in whose territory it is to be effected considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) The authority by whom the request for service is executed shall furnish a certificate proving the service or explaining the reason which has prevented such service, and setting forth the fact, the manner, and the date of such service or attempted service, and shall send the said certificate to the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom the request for service was made. The certificate of service or of attempted service shall be placed on one of the duplicates or attached thereto.

ARTICLE 4.

(a) The provisions of Articles 2 and 3 in no way prejudice the right to use, in the territory of either High Contracting Party without any request to or intervention of the authorities of the country where service is effected, any of the following methods of service in connection with judicial or extra-judicial documents drawn up in the territory of the other High Contracting Party:—

(1) Service by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document emanates;

(2) Service by an agent appointed for the purpose either by the judicial authority by whom service of the document is required or by the party on whose application the document was issued;

(3) Through the post;

(4) Any other mode of service recognized by the law existing at the time of service in the country from which the documents emanate.

(b) It is understood that the validity and effect of any such service will remain a matter for the determination of the respective courts of the High Contracting Parties in accordance with their law.

(c) The High Contracting Parties agree that in principle it is desirable that documents served by any of these methods should, unless the recipient is a subject of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document to be served emanates, either be drawn up in the language of the country in which service is to be effected or accompanied by a translation into such language. Nevertheless, in the absence of any legislation in their respective territories making translations obligatory in such cases, the High Contracting Parties do not accept any obligation in this respect.

ARTICLE 5.

(a) In any case where documents have been served in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, the High Contracting Party, by whose Diplomatic or Consular Officer the request for service is addressed, shall pay to the other High Contracting Party any charges and expenses which are payable under the law of the country where the service is effected to the persons employed to effect service, and any charges and expenses incurred in effecting service in a special manner. These charges and expenses shall not exceed such as are usually allowed in the courts of that country.

(b) Repayment of these charges and expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the service has been effected from the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom the request was addressed when sending to him the certificate provided for in Article 3 (g).

(c) Except as provided above, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the service of any documents.

III.—TAKING OF EVIDENCE.

ARTICLE 6.

When a judicial authority in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties requires that evidence should be taken in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such evidence may be taken in the manner prescribed in Article 7. The taking of evidence includes the production, identification, and examination of documents.

ARTICLE 7.

(a) The judicial authority by whom the evidence is required may, in accordance with the provisions of its law, address itself by means of "Letters of Request" to the competent authority of the country where the evidence is to be taken, requesting such authority to take the evidence.

(b) The "Letter of Request" shall be drawn up in the language of the country where the evidence is to be taken, or be accompanied by a translation in such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose judicial authority the request emanates, or by a sworn translator of one of the two countries concerned. The "Letters of Request" shall state the nature of the proceedings for which the evidence is required, the full names of the parties thereto, and the full names, addresses, and descriptions of the witnesses. They shall also either be accompanied by a list of interrogatories to be put to the witness or witnesses and a translation thereof certified as correct in the manner heretofore provided, or shall contain full instructions or information as to the matters in relation to which evidence is required, or alternatively shall request the competent authority to allow such questions to be asked *visa voce* as the parties or their representatives shall desire to ask.

(c) The "Letters of Request" shall be transmitted—

In England by a Norwegian Diplomatic or Consular Officer to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

In Norway by a British Diplomatic or Consular Officer to the Tribunal of First Instance in the jurisdiction of which the evidence is to be taken.

In case the authority to whom "Letters of Request" are transmitted is not competent to execute them, such authority shall forward the "Letters of Request" without any further request to the competent authority of his own country.

(d) The competent authority to whom the "Letters of Request" are transmitted or forwarded shall give effect thereto and obtain the evidence required by the use of the same compulsory measures and the same procedure as are employed in the execution of a commission or order emanating from the authorities of his own country, except that if a wish that some special procedure should be followed is expressed in the "Letters of Request" such special procedure shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of the country where the evidence is to be taken.

(e) The Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom the "Letters of Request" are transmitted, shall, if he so desires, be informed of the date and place where the proceedings will take place, in order that he may inform the interested party or parties who shall be permitted to be present in person or to be represented if they so desire.

(f) The execution of the "Letters of Request" can only be refused—

- (1) If the authenticity of the "Letters of Request" is not established;
- (2) If in the country where the evidence is to be taken the execution of the "Letters of Request" in question does not fall within the functions of the judiciary;
- (3) If the High Contracting Party in whose territory the evidence is to be taken considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) In every instance where the "Letters of Request" are not executed by the authority to whom they are addressed, the latter will at once inform the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom they were transmitted, stating the grounds on which the execution of the "Letters of Request" has been refused, or the judicial authority to whom they have been forwarded.

ARTICLE 8.

(a) The provisions of Articles 6 or 7 in no way prejudice the right of taking evidence, required by a judicial authority in the territory of one High Contracting Party, in the territory of the other, without any request to or intervention of the authorities of the country where the evidence is taken, by a person qualified to do so according to the law of the country by whose court the evidence is required. Such person may

be a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party whose court requires the evidence or any other suitable person directly appointed for the purpose.

(b) It is understood that where the method of taking evidence referred to in the preceding paragraph is employed the procedure must be entirely voluntary and no measures of compulsion can be employed, and the admissibility of evidence so taken remains a matter for the determination of the respective courts of the High Contracting Parties in accordance with their law.

ARTICLE 9.

The fact that an attempt to take evidence by the method mentioned in Article 8 has failed owing to the refusal of any witness to appear, to give evidence, or to produce documents, does not preclude a request being subsequently made in accordance with Article 7.

ARTICLE 10.

(a) Where evidence is taken in the manner provided in Article 7 the High Contracting Party by whose judicial authority the "Letters of Request" are addressed shall repay to the other High Contracting Party any expenses incurred by the competent authority of the latter in the execution of the request in respect of any charges and expenses payable to witnesses, experts, interpreters, or translators, the costs of obtaining the attendance of witnesses who have not appeared voluntarily, and the charges and expenses payable to any person whom such authority may have deputed to act in cases where the law of his own country permits this to be done, and any charges and expenses incurred by reason of a special procedure being requested and followed. These expenses shall be such as are usually allowed in similar cases in the courts of the country where the evidence has been taken.

(b) The repayment of these expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the "Letters of Request" have been executed from the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom they were transmitted when sending to him the documents establishing their execution.

(c) Except as above provided, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the taking of evidence.

IV.—JUDICIAL ASSISTANCE FOR POOR PERSONS, IMPRISONMENT FOR DEBT, AND SECURITY FOR COSTS.

ARTICLE 11.

The subjects of one High Contracting Party shall enjoy in the territory of the other High Contracting Party a perfect equality of treatment with subjects of that High Contracting Party as regards free judicial assistance for poor persons and imprisonment for debt; and provided that they are resident in any such territory, shall not be compelled to give security for costs in any case where a subject of such other High Contracting Party would not be so compelled.

V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

ARTICLE 12.

Any difficulties which may arise in connection with the operation of this Convention shall be settled through the diplomatic channel.

ARTICLE 13.

The present Convention, of which the English and Norwegian texts are equally authentic, shall be subject to ratification. Ratifications shall be exchanged in London. The Convention shall come into force one month after the date on which ratifications are exchanged and shall remain in force for three years after the date of its coming into force. If neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice through the diplomatic channel to the other not less than six months before the expiration of the said period of three years of his intention to terminate the Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to terminate it.

ARTICLE 14.

(a) This Convention shall not apply *ipso facto* to Scotland or Northern Ireland, nor to any of His Britannic Majesty's Colonies or Protectorates, nor to any territories under his suzerainty, nor to any mandated territories administered by his Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, but His Britannic Majesty may at any time, while the Convention is in force, under Article 13, by a notification given through his Minister at Oslo, extend the operation of this Convention to any of the above-mentioned territories.

(b) Such notification shall state the authorities in the territory concerned to whom requests for service or for the taking of evidence are to be transmitted, and the language

in which communications and translations are to be made. The date of the coming into force of any such extension shall be one month from the date of such notification.

(c) Either of the High Contracting Parties may, at any time after the expiry of three years from the coming into force of an extension of this Convention to any of the territories referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article, terminate such extension on giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel.

(d) The termination of the Convention under Article 13 shall, unless otherwise expressly agreed to by both High Contracting Parties, *ipso facto* terminate it in respect of any territories to which it has been extended under paragraph (a) of this Article.

ARTICLE 15.

(a) His Britannic Majesty may at any time, while the present Convention is in force, either under Article 13 or by virtue of any accession under this article, by a notification given through the diplomatic channel accede to the present Convention in respect of any of His self-governing Dominions or India, provided that no notification of accession may be given at any time when His Majesty the King of Norway has given notice of termination in respect of all the territories of His Britannic Majesty to which the Convention applies. The provisions of Article 14 (b) shall be applicable to such notification. Any such accession shall take effect one month after the date of its notification.

(b) After the expiry of three years from the date of the coming into force of any accession under paragraph (a) of this Article, either of the High Contracting Parties may, by giving a six-months notice of termination through the diplomatic channel, terminate the application of the Convention to any country in respect of which a notification of accession has been given. The termination of the Convention under Article 13 shall not affect its application to any such country.

(c) Any notification of accession under paragraph (a) of this Article may include any dependency or mandated territory administered by the Government of the country in respect of which such notification of accession is given; and any notice of termination in respect of any such country under

paragraph (b) shall apply to any dependency or mandated territory which was included in the notification of accession in respect of that country.
