or revoked : Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby vary an Order in Council dated the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, meanding To Kuit 2n.7 and other block set out in the regarding Te Kuiti 2B 7 and other blocks set out in the Schedule to such Order in Council, by excluding and excepting from prohibition of alienation the land set out in the Schedule hereto.
