WHEREAS by section one hundred and sixty-two of the Land Act, 1924, it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Order in Council on the recommendation of the Land Board, declare that any land comprised in a kauri-gum reserve shall, from a date to be specified in the Order, cease to be subject to the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908, and on and after the date so specified the land to which the Order relates shall become subject to the provisions of the Land Act. 1924. the Land Act, 1924

And whereas the Land Board of the North Auckland Land District has duly passed a resolution recommending that portion of the Marsden Kauri-gun Reserve, as described in the Schedule hereto, be excepted from the operations of the Kauri-gun Industry Act, 1908, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation :

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section one hundred and sixty-two of the Land Act, 1924, and section one hundred and sixty-two of the Land Act, 1924, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby order and declare that portion of the Marsden Kauri-gum Reserve, as de-scribed in the Schedule hereto, shall, from the thirtieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, cease to be subject to the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908.
