

Order in Council consenting to the Raising of Loans by the Auckland Transport Board on the Instalment-repayment System.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this 19th day of September, 1932.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Auckland Transport Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") has been authorized to borrow, in respect of the loans referred to in the Second Column of the Schedule hereto, the respective sums stated in the Third Column of the said Schedule, and the respective amounts shown in the Fourth Column of the said Schedule have not yet been borrowed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, and by section thirty-two of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the said local authority of the respective amounts shown in the Fourth Column of the said Schedule, for a period not exceeding twenty years, upon terms of making the said amounts together with interest thereon repayable by aggregate half-yearly instalments of principal and interest of five thousand eight hundred and fifty pounds during the first ten years of the said period, and thereafter by aggregate half-yearly instalments of principal and interest of ten thousand two hundred and seventy-two pounds ten shillings and sevenpence.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the thirtieth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and published in the *Gazette* of the second day of the following month, at page 2154, William Holder, of Auckland (hereinafter called "the licensee"), was licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore on the Tamaki River, as a site for a boat-shed :

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the sixth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 44, of the twelfth day of the same month, at page 1942 (hereinafter referred to as the first-mentioned Order in Council), Wallace Jacenoth, of Oruru, Motor Mechanic, was authorized to lay, construct, put up, place, and use certain electric lines within an area therein defined :
