RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Stratford Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £1,750, authorized to be raised by the Stratford Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act, to be called "The Stratford Borough Abattoir Loan of £1,750, 1932," for the purpose of acquiring additional lands and the erection of additional buildings and the equipment thereof for the purpose of boiling-down works in connection with the abattoir established by the Council pursuant to the Slaughtering and Inspection Act, 1908, the said Stratford Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-ninth (1/9d.) of a penny in the pound (£1) sterling on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the whole of the Borough of Stratford, and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and to be payable yearly on the first day of July in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty (20) years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
