Open Seasons for Red Deer Shooting in Portions of North Canterbury, Southland, Wellington, and Westland Acclima-tization Districts.

I N exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Adam Hamilton, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of March, 1932, to the 30th day of April, 1932 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in those portions of the North Canterbury, Southland, and Westland Acclimatization Districts described in the First, Second, and Third Schedules hereto respectively, and the period from the 15th day of March, 1932, to the 15th day of May, 1932 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in those portions of the Wellington Acclimatization District described in the Fourth Schedule hereto, for the taking or killing of the following imported game—viz., red deer stags and hinds—subject to the following conditions.
