RESOLUTION MAKING SPEICAL RATE.

Tamaki District (City of Auckland) Drainage Loan, 1931, £50,000.

HAT in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it, the Auckland City Council doth hereby resolve as follows:
