## BLEDISLOE, Governor-General. [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made on the seventeenth day of September, one clamation made on the seventeenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and published in the Ga ette of the twentieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, setting apart lands for selection by discharged soldiers under the Land Act, 1908, in so far as it relates to the land in the Schedule hereto.
