ORDER IN COUNCII.
At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 10th day of July, 1933.

## Present:

The Right Hon. J. G. Coates presiding in Council.
TTHEREAS by section four hundred and fourteen, subsection one, of the Mining Act, 1926, it is provided that the Governor-General, by Order in Council, may from time to time declare that any of the provisions of the Mining Act, 1926, shall apply to prospecting and mining for and the storage of petroleum and other mineral oils and of natural gas, and also define the districts within which any such Order in Council shall take effect :
Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said section four hundred and fourteen, subsection one, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting
by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the provisions of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the provisions
of the Mining Act, 1926, set out in the First Schedule hereto shall apply to prospecting and mining for and the storage of petroleum and other mineral oils and of natural gas within the districts described in the Second Schedule hereto.

## FIRST SCHEDULE.

The Mining Act, 1926 :-
Part I : Section 4-Definitions of Crown lands, Endowment land, Minister, Native, Native land, Native ceded land, Native reserves, Occupier, Owner, Person, Private lands, Public reserve, Unalienated Crown land ; section 7.

Part III: Sections 19 and 22.
