Revoking the Reservation over a Scenic Reserve in the North Auckland Land District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is a reserve duly set apart for scenic purposes:

And whereas the said land is no longer suitable for scenic purposes by reason of the absence of bush of scenic value thereon:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section eight of the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910, do hereby revoke the reservation for scenic purposes over the land described in the Schedule hereto.

NORTH AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT.

ALLOTMENTS 128, 129, 130, 182, and 182A, Aotearua Parish: Area, 935 acres, more or less.

Revoking the Setting-apart of Land for Selection by Discharged Soldiers, under Special Tenures, in the North Auckland Land District.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made on the twenty-ninth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and published in the *Gazette* of the eighth day of March then instant, setting apart lands for selection by discharged soldiers under the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, in so far as it relates to the land in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

NORTH AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 3 acres 0 roods 17 perches, more or less, being part Section 5, Block VI, Te Kuri Survey District. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 26/28126, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon edged red. (North Auckland plan S.O. 27355.)

Defining the Middle-line of Roads in Blocks IV and VIII, Drury Survey District—viz., Deviations of the Great South Road Main Highway, Franklin County Division.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-lines of roads desired to be constructed over Blocks IV and VIII, Drury Survey District—viz., deviations of the Great South Road Main Highway—shall be those defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

FIRSTLY, that deviation, commencing at a point on the Great South Road Main Highway opposite the north-western corner of part Lot 2 of Section 2, Village of Drury, and proceeding thence in a southerly direction generally for a distance of approximately 25 chains, and passing in, into, through, or over the following lands, &c.—viz., portion of the said Great South Road Main Highway; Sections 1 and 4, Village of Drury; and a further portion of the said Great South Road Main Highway, and terminating at a point on such Main Highway opposite the north-western corner of part Lot 4, D.P. 8668, being part Section 4, Village of Drury; all in Block IV, Drury Survey District, marked "A-B" on plan.
