

Revoking a Sanctuary under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, North Canterbury Acclimatization District.

BLEDISLOE, Governor-General.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section six of the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Warrant made under the said section on the twentieth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, and published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-first day of the same month, at page 445, declaring certain areas to be sanctuaries under the said Act in so far as that Warrant relates to the area in the Canterbury Land District situated in Mytholm, Lake Sumner, Marion, Saddle, Minchin, Katrine, and Noble Survey Districts, included under the heading "North Canterbury Acclimatization District," being under the subheading "Area at Lake Sumner."

Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces amended.—Amendments No. 37.

BLEDISLOE, Governor-General.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Defence Act, 1909, and its amendments, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend, in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto, the Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the sixth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five; and I do hereby declare that the amendments hereby made shall take effect as from the date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

FINANCIAL INSTRUCTIONS AND ALLOWANCE REGULATIONS FOR THE NEW ZEALAND MILITARY FORCES.

1. PARAGRAPH 50: Add at end of paragraph the following: "The provisions of this paragraph will not apply to single personnel required for military reasons to live in barracks, under military discipline."
2. Paragraph 52 (i): After "Jackets, S.D." and detail insert "Overalls, Mechanics (h)...1," and add the following footnote: "(h) For New Zealand Permanent Air Force and armament artificers and blacksmiths, N.Z. Army Ordnance Corps, in lieu of jackets and trousers, denim."
3. Paragraph 155 (2), line 2: Delete the words "eight years" and substitute "twelve years."

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on me by section twenty-five of the Mining Act, 1926, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare that the education reserve described in the Schedule hereto shall be brought within the operation of the Mining Act, 1926; and do hereby further declare that this notice shall take effect as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Otago Land District, containing by admeasurement 140 acres, more or less, being Section 3, Block III, Rankleburn Survey District, and bounded as follows: Towards the north by Crown land, 2514 links; towards the east by Section 10, Block II, and a public road, 3031 links, the crossing of a public road and again towards the east by said Section 10 and the abuttal of a closed road, 3179 links; towards the south-west by the Pomahaka River

road reserve, 3700 links; towards the west by Section 6, Block III, 1860 links, the crossing of a public road, and again towards the west by a public road and said Section 6, 2118 links: and excepting from the above one intersecting public road 100 links wide, a deduction for which has been made from the area: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less. As the same is more particularly shown on the plan marked Mines N. 6/4/18, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Mines, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.
