NOTICE TO MARINERS, 1933, No. 5.

AUSTRALIA.—EAST COAST.—WIDE BAY.

Double Island Point: Intended Alteration in Light.

MARINERS and others are hereby notified that the period and candle-power of the flashing white light on Double Island Point will be altered on or about 21st November, 1933.

Position: On the summit of Double Island Point. Lat., 25° 56' S.; long, 153° 13' E., on Chart No. 1068.

Alterations:—

Character: The flashing white light showing 0.3 second flash every 2.5 seconds will be altered to show one flash every 7.5 seconds, thus—Flash, 0.35 sec.; eclipse, 7.15 sec.

Power: The power will be increased from 100,000 candles to 750,000 candles.

(NOTE:—In other respects the light will remain unaltered. Further notice will be given when the alterations have been completed.)

Whangamomona County.—Pouatu Survey District.

SECTION 18, Block XV: Area, 659 acres. Capital value, £180; half-yearly rent, £3 12s.

After payment of first half-year's rent, lease fee, and broken period rent (if any), a remission of rent will be allowed for a period of two years provided improvements to the value of £15 are effected annually during the exemption period.

Weighted with £230 for improvements, comprising about 100 chains fencing, 50 acres felling and grassing, and about 20 acres clearing and stumping. This amount may be either paid in cash or taken over by way of first mortgage to the State Advances Superintendent for a term of thirty years, with interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum.

This property is situated about eight miles and a half from Kohuratahi Railway-station and about four miles from the Kohuratahi School.

It comprises about 30 acres ploughable land and approximately 40 acres fairly easy country; balance is steep sandstone country. About 300 acres is in bush. The balance has been felled and grassed, but this has reverted generally to fern and second growth.

The estimated carrying-capacity in its present condition is 150 ewes and 20 steers and heifers.
