HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the regulation numbered 2 under the heading "Unclaimed Letters" made

by Order in Council on the seventeenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the eighteenth day of the same month, and appearing at page 182 thereof, also the regulation relating to unclaimed letters made by Order in Council on the seventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the tenth day of the same month, at page 3498; and in lieu thereof doth make the regulation set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth declare that such revocation and the regulation hereby made shall have effect on and from the date of publication of this Order in Council in the *Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

UNCLAIMED LETTERS.

1. ALL letters (excepting special-request letters) unclaimed at the end of the periods specified below shall be forwarded to the Dead Letter Office. Thereupon letters from beyond New Zealand shall be returned unopened to the countries where they originated, and letters originating in New Zealand shall be opened and returned to the writers.

LETTERS.

	Shall be forwarded to the Dead Letter Office after having been retained from Date of Receipt for
(a) Addressed to the care of a post-office, or addressed to an office for delivery over the counter (except letters provided for in (b)) :—	
Inland	One month.
From Australia	One month.
From other countries	Two months.
(b) Addressed to a person who has gone away without leaving an address; addressed to a specified house or street, or to a rural delivery, for a person who nevertheless cannot be found; or addressed to a private box and returned to the post-office as undeliverable :—	
Inland	One week.
From other countries	One month.
(c) Addressed to ships at sea-ports	Two months.

Unclaimed letters not provided for herein shall be forwarded to the Dead Letter Office immediately it is ascertained that they cannot be delivered, with the exception that insufficiently-addressed letters from overseas the addresses of which contain the town of delivery shall be retained against inquiry for one month in the case of letters from Australia and for two months in the case of letters from other countries.

Amending Regulations for Trout-fishing in the Auckland Acclimatization District.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and the seventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and published in the *Gazette* of the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, at page 2535, and the fifteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, at page 1995, respectively, regulations were made for trout-fishing in the Auckland Acclimatization District and the waters thereof :

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said regulations of the seventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the hereinbefore-recited Order in Council of the seventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and doth hereby substitute the following regulations in lieu thereof.
