Land set apart as a Permanent State Forest.

A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section eighteen of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby set apart the land described in the Schedule hereto as a permanent State forest.

SCHEDULE.

NELSON LAND DISTRICT.—NELSON-MARLBOROUGH FOREST-CONSERVATION REGION.

(Part of Golden Downs Plantation.)

ALL those areas in the Nelson Land District, containing by admeasurement 2 acres 1 rood 15-6 perches, more or less, being formerly portions of road closed by a Proclamation dated 8th July, 1933, and published in *Gazette* No. 56 of 1933, at page 1886, situated in Block X, Gordon Survey District, and described as follows:—

All that area containing by admeasurement 2 acres 0 roods 29-5 perches, more or less, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the west by a road; towards the north-west by Reserve B (State forest—*Gazette*, 1931, page 219); towards the east by a closed road; and towards the south-east by Reserve B aforesaid.

Also all that area containing by admeasurement 5-3 perches, more or less, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the south by a public road; and towards the north-west and north-east by Section 2s, Golden Downs Settlement (State forest—*Gazette*, 1931, page 219).

Also all that area containing by admeasurement 20-8 perches, more or less, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the south-east by a public road; towards the south by a closed road; and towards the north by Section 1s, Golden Downs Settlement (State forest—*Gazette*, 1931, page 219). As the same are more particularly delineated on plan No. 108/24, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service at Wellington, and thereon bordered red. (Nelson plan S.O. 428r.)

SCHEDULE.

AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT.—AUCKLAND FOREST-CONSERVATION REGION.

(Part of Tairua Plantation.)

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 1 acre 3 roods 38-2 perches, more or less, being part of Section 5, Block XII, Tairua Survey District, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the east by a public road; towards the south by another part of Section 5 aforesaid; towards the south-west by a provisional State forest (*Gazette*, 1920, page 924); and towards the north by another part of Section 5 aforesaid. As the same is more particularly delineated on plan No. 23/28, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service at Wellington, and thereon bordered blue. (Auckland plan S.O. 26656.)

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and I do also declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three.
