Australia.—South Coast.—Victoria.—Cape Nelson.—Intended alteration in Light: Temporary Light to be exhibited.

MARINERS and others are hereby notified that the occulting light with white and red sectors will be altered on or about 17th March, 1934.

Position: Lat., 38° 26' S.; long., 141° 33' E., on Chart No. 1062.

Alterations :-

Character: The occulting light with white and red sectors will be replaced by a group flashing light, with white and red sectors, showing four flashes every twenty seconds, thus: Flash, 0.23 sec.; eclipse, 2.43 sec.; flash, 0.23 sec.; eclipse, 2.43 sec.; flash, 0.23 sec.; flash, 0.23 sec.; eclipse, 11.76 sec.

Power: The power of the white light will be increased from 35,000 candles to 608,000 candles, and that of the red
