Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Hawke's Bay Rivers Act, 1919, and of every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby determine the said matters as follows :

 The sum of £33,000, being the cost of works already executed, shall be borne wholly by the Board.
The cost of the Washout Traffic Bridge, after deducting the contributions from the Main Highways Board, shall be apportioned equally between the Board and the County Control Council.

3. The cost of the works to be executed, excluding the Washout Traffic Bridge, shall, after deducting all contributions, grants-in-aid, and subsidies from other sources, be paid by the bodies listed hereunder in the same proportions as the sums respectively set opposite their names bear to the sum of £36,000.
