ALTERATION AND RECONSTITUTION OF LOCAL DISTRICTS.

THEREAS by section 2 of the Public Trust Office Amendment Act, 1921-22, it is enacted that the Public

Trustee may, by notice in the Gazette, from time to time establish and define, abolish, alter, and reconstitute local districts for the purposes of the said Act:
