

*Limits of Harbour of Nelson defined.*

BLDISLOE, Governor-General.

WHEREAS on the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-third day of the same month, at page 549, certain limits were defined for the Port of Nelson under the Marine Act, 1867:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said definition and to define the limits of the Harbour of Nelson:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in me vested by section six of the Harbours Act, 1923, do hereby revoke the previous definition of the Port of Nelson, and do hereby declare that the limits of the Harbour of Nelson shall extend to and include all tidal waters of Nelson Haven and all waters comprised within the area enclosed by the arc of a circle having a radius of five miles from the easternmost point of Sandy or Rabbit Island. As the said area is more particularly shown and delineated on plan marked M.D. 7311, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.
