

TE AWAMUTU BOROUGH COUNCIL.

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by Part II of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, and the Te Awamutu Borough Loans Conversion Order, 1934 (No. 2), the Te Awamutu Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

“That, for the purpose of providing the half-yearly instalments of principal and interest in respect of the new securities authorized to be issued by the Te Awamutu Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act and Order in conversion of existing securities issued in respect of the loans set out in the First Schedule to that Order, and also the instalments of principal and interest in respect of the unconverted securities issued in respect of such loans, the said Te Awamutu Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of fourpence and four-tenths of a penny in the pound upon the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property of the Borough of Te Awamutu, and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such securities and be payable yearly on the 31st day of January in each and every year until the last maturity date of such securities, being the 31st day of January, 1960, or until all such securities are fully paid off.”

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Mosgiel Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—
