HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

HEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and published in the Gazette of the eleventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, at page 2562, regulations were made under the Cook Islands Act, 1915, prescribing a duty to be paid on all copra exported from the Cook Islands:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twentieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and published in the Gazette of the fifth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, at page 953, the rate of duty on copra exported from any of the Cook Islands, other than Niue, was suspended for a period ending on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General, pursuant to the Cook Islands Act, 1915, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby prescribe that during the period commencing on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and ending on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five (both dates inclusive), no duty shall be payable upon copra exported from any of the Cook Islands, other than Niue, but that thereafter the duty upon copra imposed by the said regulationsnamely, a duty of £1 per ton—shall again be payable.
