BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section eighteen of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, Sir Michael Myers, Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby set apart the national-endowment land described in the Schedule hereto as a provisional State forest.

SCHEDULE.

WESTLAND LAND DISTRICT.—WESTLAND FOREST-CONSERVATION REGION.

ALL those areas of national-endowment land in the Westland Land District, containing by admeasurement 1,446 acres, more or less, and described as follows:—

All that area containing by admeasurement 1,380 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks VII and XI, Ahaura Survey District, and bounded as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the eastern boundary of the said Block XI with the north-eastern boundary of Section 31; thence westerly along the north-eastern, northern, and north-western boundaries of the said section and the said north-western boundary produced to the right bank of the Ahaura River to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 1 produced easterly; thence westerly to and along the said boundary and the said boundary produced westerly to the right bank of the Ahaura River; thence northerly and westerly along the right bank of the Ahaura River to the eastern boundary of Reserve 1738 (provisional State forest, *Gazette*, 1930, page 3127); thence along the eastern boundary of the said reserve to the southern side of the Ahaura-Kopara Road; thence along the southern side of the said road to the north-eastern corner of Section 3246; thence across the said road to the south-eastern corner of Section 3102; thence along the eastern boundary of Section 3102 and the eastern boundary produced to the south-western boundary of Reserve 1694 (provisional State forest, *Gazette*, 1919, page 1283); thence south-easterly along the said boundary of Reserve 1694 to its intersection with the eastern boundary of Block VII, Ahaura Survey District; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of Blocks VII and XI, Ahaura Survey District, to the commencing-point; save and excepting all internal roads and reserves.

Also all that area situated in Block XI, Ahaura Survey District, containing by admeasurement 66 acres, more or less, and bounded as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the eastern boundary of Block XI, Ahaura Survey District, with the south-eastern boundary of Section 31; thence

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southerly along the eastern boundary of Block XI aforesaid to the right bank of the Ahaura River; thence westerly and northerly along the said right bank to its intersection with the south-eastern boundary produced of Section 31; thence to and along the said boundary to the commencing-point.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 10th day of April, 1935.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN
COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section thirty-four of the Cook Islands Act, 1915, and of every other authority enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations, 1916, in the manner herein set forth.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1935, and shall be read together with and form part of the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations, 1916 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations").

2. Clause 7 (3) of the principal regulations, as amended by the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1932, is hereby further amended by adding after the words "Treasurer of Rarotonga" the words "or other officer appointed by the Resident Commissioner of Rarotonga"

to act in his stead," and by adding after the words "Resident Commissioner of Rarotonga" the words "or other officer appointed by him to act in his stead."

3. Clause 7 (4) of the principal regulations, as amended by the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1932, is hereby further amended by adding after the words "Accountant, Cook Islands Department," the words "or other officer appointed by the Secretary for the Cook Islands to act in that capacity for the purposes of these regulations," and by adding after the words "Secretary for the Cook Islands" the words "or other officer authorized by him to act in his stead."

4. Clause 7 (5) of the principal regulations, as amended by the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1932, is hereby further amended by adding after the words "Treasurer of Niue" the words "or other officer appointed by the Resident Commissioner of Niue to act in his stead," and by adding after the words "Resident Commissioner of Niue" the words "or other officer authorized by him to act in his stead."

5. Clause 7 (6) of the principal regulations, as amended by the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1932, is hereby further amended by adding after the words "Accountant of the External Affairs Department" the words "or other officer appointed by the Secretary for External Affairs to act in that capacity for the purposes of these regulations."

ORDER.

SHORT TITLE.

1. This Order may be cited as the Samoa Registration of Europeans Regulations Amendment, 1935, and shall form part of the Samoa Registration of Europeans Regulations, 1920.

RECTIFYING REGISTER.

2. The Registrar shall forthwith after any European has been declared to be a Samoan in accordance with the Samoan Status Ordinance, 1935, remove the name of such person from the Register of Europeans and shall cause to be published in the next issue thereafter of the *Western Samoa Gazette* and the *Savali* the name of the person so removed and the reason for such removal.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section twenty-five of the Naval Defence Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend and supplement the regulations referred to in the Schedule hereto as shown therein.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations for the Government and Payment of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy, 1929.

Article 106, clauses 1 and 2 : Cancel, and substitute—

“106. **Deferred Pay : Officers.**—Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines loaned for service in the New Zealand Division are ineligible for deferred pay, the New Zealand Government contributing towards their pensions or retired pay in the Imperial Service at rates agreed with the Admiralty.

2. Deferred pay is payable to other officers of the New Zealand Division at the following rates, subject to the conditions in paragraphs 3 and 4, and to Article 134 so far as applicable :—

223. **Officers obliged to join other Messes : Difference of Mess Subscriptions.**—Clause 2 : Cancel, and substitute—

“2. Sub-Lieutenants in command are also to be paid this allowance.”

Article 224, clause 1 : Cancel, and substitute—

“224. **Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank and Warrant Officers.**—Where there is no warrant officers' mess, commissioned officers from warrant rank and warrant officers are required to join the mess which includes the other officers, and to meet the increased expense they will be allowed the difference between 15s. for each complete calendar month and the amount contributed monthly by the officers of the mess, but the maximum amount payable under this regulation is not to exceed £2 5s. for each complete calendar month. For broken periods payment is to be made at a rate not exceeding 1s. 6d. a day.”
