ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 10th day of April, 1935.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN
COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section thirty-four of the Cook Islands Act, 1915, and of every other authority enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations, 1916, in the manner herein set forth.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1935, and shall be read together with and form part of the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations, 1916 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations").

2. Clause 7 (3) of the principal regulations, as amended by the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1932, is hereby further amended by adding after the words "Treasurer of Rarotonga" the words "or other officer appointed by the Resident Commissioner of Rarotonga".
