Lands in the Otago Land District proclaimed as ceasing to be set apart as National-endowment Land.

[L.S.] GALWAY, Governor-General. A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, as amended by section ten of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, it is enacted that on the disposal of any national-endowment land by way of sale, or on the acquisition of the fee-simple of any such land, the Governor-General may by Proclamation declare that such land shall, as from a date to be specified in the Proclamation, cease to be national-endowment land:

And whereas the fee-simple of the lands described in the

And whereas the fee-simple of the lands described in the Schedule hereto (being lands heretofore held on small grazing-run lease tenure) has been acquired, and it is expedient that the said lands should cease to be national-endowment land:

the said lands should cease to be national-endowment land:
Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers
and authorities conferred upon me by the aforesaid section
three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, I, George
Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the
Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare
that the lands described in the Schedule hereto, which were
set apart as national-endowment land under the provisions
of section two hundred and fifty-eight of the Land Act, 1908,
ceased to be national-endowment land as from the dates ceased to be national-endowment land as from the dates given in the said Schedule.
