Notice under the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, prohibiting the Sale in the City of Palmerston North of certain Goods comprised in the Trade of a Tobacconist.

WHEREAS a petition in writing, signed by a majority of the occupiers of all the tobacconists' shops within the City of Palmerston North, has been forwarded to me desiring that the sale of certain goods comprised in the trade of a tobacconist—namely, smoking requisites—be prohibited during such time as the said shops are required to be closed in pursuance of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22:

And whereas I, Adam Hamilton, Minister of Labour, am satisfied that the sale of the said goods is comprised in the trade of a tobacconist in the said district, and that the signatures to such petition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the said shops in the said district:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of section 33 of the said Act, I do hereby direct that on and after the 17th day of June, 1935, the sale of the said goods in the City of Palmerston North shall be and is hereby prohibited as follows: On Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays after the hour of 6 p.m., and on Saturdays after the hour of 10 p.m., with the following exceptions—(1) Subject to the next succeeding exception from the 21st to the 31st December the sale of the said goods is prohibited after the hour of 10 p.m.; (2) on the working-day immediately preceding Christmas Day and on the working-day immediately preceding New Year's Day the sale of the said goods is prohibited after the hour of 10.30 p.m.; and (3) during Winter and Spring Show weeks and on the working-day immediately preceding any day generally observed in the City of Palmerston North as a whole holiday the sale of the said goods is prohibited after the hour of 8.30 p.m.:

The notice gazetted on the 28th May, 1925, prohibiting the sale in the Borough of Palmerston North of certain goods comprised in the trade of a tobacconist shall be and is hereby cancelled as from the date of the coming into operation of this notice.
