Vesting the Control of a Scenic Reserve in the Everett Road Scenic Board.

GALWAY, Governor-General.

TN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule below (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act) in the undermentioned persons, namely:—

The Mayor of the Borough of Inglewood (ex officio), who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Everett Road Scenic Reserve Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business at the office of Mr. W. C. Deem, Solicitor, Matai Street, Inglewood, on the first Wednesday in the months of December and June in each year, at eight o'clock p.m., or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held at eight o'clock p.m. on Wednesday, the fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman,

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at

each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting meeting.
7. (a) The Board may make such rules as it deems

(b) The Board may appropriate open portions of the reserve for parking-places for vehicles for the convenience of persons using the reserve, and fix such charges for the use of such parking-places as the Minister approves.

8. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be

a member of the Board in his stead.

9. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual

meeting.

10. The Board shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations

Extradition Treaty with Austria.

AUSTRIA (EXTRADITION: COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1935.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 & 34 Vict., c. 52) to 1932 (22 & 23, Geo. 5, c. 39) it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 3rd day of December, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals which Treaty was amended by a Declaration signed on the 26th day of

And whereas the said Treaty and Declaration were duly ratified:

And whereas under the provisions of Article 3 of the Sup-And whereas under the provisions of Article 3 of the Supplementary Convention signed on the 29th day of October, 1934, between His Majesty and the Federal President of Austria for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the Austrian (Extradition) Order in Council, 1935, and are as follows:—

who, having communicated to each other their full powers,
found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention Article 2 of the Extradition Treaty, signed at Vienna on the 3rd December, 1873, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:

"Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made."

Article 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition pro-The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Austria on the one hand and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Article 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty at Vienna. From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment set forth in Article I shall apply to extradition proceedings between Austria on the one hand and, on the other, the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is exercised by the Government of the

by His Majesty and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

Article 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December,
