#### A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by the Public Works Act, 1928, it is enacted that if at any time after the issue or making of any Proclamation taking land under this Act, and before the payment or award of any compensation in respect to the taking thereof, it is found that the land or any part thereof is not required for the purpose for which it was taken, the Governor-General may, by a subsequent Proclamation gazetted, revoke the former Proclamation, either wholly or so far as he thinks necessary:

And whereas it is found that the additional land at Milton taken for the purposes of the Waitaki-Bluff Railway by a Proclamation made under the Public Works Act, 1928, dated the nineteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six (hereinafter termed "the said Proclamation"), and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 16 of the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, at page 331, is not required for the purposes for which it was taken:

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.
