FEDERATED MALAY STATES.

THE PROBATE AND ADMINISTRATION ENACTMENT (CHAPTER 8 OF THE REVISED EDITION).

Order applying the Provisions of Chapter XVII to the Dominion of New Zealand.

Whereas the High Commissioner is satisfied that the Legislature of the Dominion of New Zealand has made adequate lature of the Dominion of New Zealand has made adequate provision for the recognition there of probates and letters of administration granted by the Supreme Court of the Federated Malay States: Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Chief Secretary by section 158 (ii) of the Probate and Administration Enactment (Cap. 8) and by virtue of the Chief Secretary (Devolution of Powers) Enactment, 1936, the High Commissioner hereby orders that the provisions of Chapter XVII of the said enactment shall apply to the Dominion of New Zealand.
