BOROUGH OF WESTPORT.

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

Tar-sealing Supplementary Loan of £1,500, 1936.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and of all other powers (if any) it thereunto enabling, the Westport Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

"That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of interest, principal, and other charges on the Westport Borough Council Tar-sealing Supplementary Loan, 1936, of £1,500, authorized to be raised by the said Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of completing the reconstruction and paving of the streets in the Borough of Westport with tar and bitumen and reconstructing and top-dressing the footpaths in the following streets—namely, Palmerston, Russell, Queen, Peel, Derby, Gladstone, Bright, Lyttelton, Cobden, Nelson, Pakington, Henley, Lyndhurst, Brougham, Wakefield, Rintoul, Fonblanque, Mill, Bentham, and Adderley—the said Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-third of a penny ($\frac{1}{3}$ d.) in the pound on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the Borough of Westport, and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable yearly on the first day of June in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of ten (10) years or until the loan is fully paid off."

The above resolution was duly passed at a meeting of the Westport Borough Council held on the 24th day of February, 1937.
