

authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby vary certain of the determinations aforesaid in respect of the said loan by prescribing as follows:—

(1) In lieu of the term of twenty (20) years specified in clause one of the said Order in Council the term shall be ten (10) years.

(2) In lieu of repayment as specified in clause three of the said Order in Council the said sum shall be repaid as follows:—

(a) By twenty equal payments of one hundred and sixty eight pounds four shillings and twopence (£168 4s. 2d.), one of such payments to be made at the end of every half-year commencing from the date on which the said loan was borrowed. Each such half-yearly payment shall be applied firstly in payment of interest computed at the rate of three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum on the amount of the principal for the time being outstanding at the beginning of each half-year and the balance of such half-yearly payment in reduction of principal.

(b) By a payment at the end of the tenth year from the date of the borrowing of the said loan of a sum equal to the amount to which the said principal has been reduced in accordance with the preceding paragraph (a) hereof after payment of the aforesaid twenty (20) half-yearly payments.
