IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the following resolution passed by the Waikohu County Council on the fourteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, viz. :—

“The Waikohu County Council, being the local authority having control of the roads in the Waikohu County, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1928, shall not apply to that portion of road known as Morris Road adjoining Lots 18 (part Section 20) and 19 (part Sections 19 and 20), Karaka Block, Te Karaka Town District”;

subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the portion of Morris Road (described in the Schedule hereto) within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre-line of the said portion of road.

“That the Thames Borough Council, being the local authority having control of the streets in the Borough of Thames, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1928, shall not apply to those portions of streets known as Broad and Keddell Streets, adjoining those pieces of land situated in the Borough of Thames, being Lots 595, 596, 597, 598, and 599 of the Kanaeranga Nos. 5 and 5A Blocks, and being part of the land comprised and described in Certificate of Title (limited as to parcels), Volume 559, folio 137, of the Register-book at Auckland”;
