“That the Dunedin City Council, being the local authority having control of the streets in the City of Dunedin, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1928, shall not apply to the south-western side of portion of Duckworth Street abutting on part Lot 10, Extension of Oaklands Estate”;

subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the south-western side of the portion of Duckworth Street (described in the Schedule hereto) within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre line of the said portion of street.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section nine of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928, doth hereby declare that, from and after the day of the date hereof, the balance of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto shall become vested in the Waimakariri River Trust in trust for river-conservation purposes.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District containing by admeasurement 3,680 acres, more or less, and being part of Reserve No. 3542, situated in Blocks IV, VII, and VIII, Rolleston Survey District, and Blocks I, II, V, and VI, Christchurch Survey District, and being all Reserve No. 3542 as particularly described in the Warrant dated the seventh day of December, one thousand nine hundred and one (*Gazette*, 1902, page 8); save and except thereout all that portion of the said reserve as particularly described in the Order in Council dated the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and two (*Gazette*, 1902, page 2648).
