A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of public buildings of the General Government; and I do also declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

SCHEDULE.

APPROXIMATE area of the piece of land taken: 38.05 perches. Being part Allotment 21, Township of Toshvale, and being part Section 10.

Situated in Block XXXV, Clutha Survey District (Otago R.D.). (S.O. 6001.)

In the Otago Land District; as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 97183, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, and thereon coloured red.
