WHEREAS the Wellington City Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") being desirous of raising the sum of thirty-nine thousand five hundred pounds (£39,500) to be known as "Wellington City Milk Supply Loan, 1933, Renewal Loan, 1938" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of repaying the amount of the Milk Supply Loan, 1933, which matures on the thirty-first March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and which is not provided for by the accumulated sinking funds, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council as required by the said Act should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan up to the amount of thirty-nine thousand five hundred pounds (£39,500), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall be ten (10) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten
