Rangitaiki Land Drainage Act.—Notice making and levying Special Rates.

WHEREAS by section 6 of the Rangitaiki Land Drainage Act, 1910, it is enacted that the Minister of Lands may from time to time make and levy a special rate on lands in the district constituted under the said Act for the repay-ment of moneys raised pursuant to section 4 of the said Act, together with interest thereon, at such rate as the Minister of Finance determines:
