BAY OF ISLANDS ELECTRIC-POWER DISTRICT.

PURSUANT to section 13 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, I hereby give notice that at a poll of the ratepayers of the Bay of Islands Electric-power District taken on the 11th day of May, 1938, on the proposal of the Bay of Islands Electric-power Board to borrow the sum of two hundred thousand pounds (£200,000) for the purpose of arranging for the supply and distribution of electric-power to the Bay of Islands Electric-power District and for the construction of all works incidental thereto, and in respect of which works, guarantees as described in clauses 21-24 of the Electric Supply Regulations, 1935, have first been given in favour of the Power Board for repayments amounting in each of not less than five consecutive years from the completion of such works to at least 14 per cent. of the estimated capital cost of such works; and of providing funds for the purposes mentioned in section 118 of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925—namely, making advances to consumers.
