A PROCLAMATION.

TN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of a road desired to be constructed over Block IV, Mata Survey District, and Block XVI, Mangaoporo Survey District—viz., a deviation of the No. 24 Gisborne—Te Araroa State Highway—shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

## SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point on the existing No. 24 Gisborne – Te Araroa State Highway at a point on the southern boundary of Ngamoe A 6 Block, Block IV, Mata Survey District, 16 chains from the eastern corner of the said Ngamoe A 6 Block, and proceeding thence in a north-westerly direction generally for a distance of approximately 37 chains, and passing in, into, through, or over the following lands, &c.,—viz., part Ngamoe Nos.
