Page 46.—"Aeroboard" (plain hard rubber sheets).

" 46.—Bags—viz., gas-bags, rubber, for regulating the supply of acetylene gas to a lamp.

" 46.—Bags of rubber or rubber coated or covered with textile, for preventing escape of gas during repairs to mains.

" 46.—Billiard-cushion rubber in strips, whether moulded solid or built up from sheet rubber.

" 46.—Bottles, rubber or vulcanite, for acids.

" 50.—Drain-testing appliance—viz., smoke-bag and bag drain stopper of rubber.

" 52.—"Menda-Tear" outfits, consisting of strips of prepared textile and rubber tissue, for mending clothing.
