## A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section twenty of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Lands, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto, being portions of a provisional State forest set apart by Proclamation dated the sixteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and gazetted on the twenty-fifth day of that month, is required for settlement purposes; and, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, such land shall, from and after the day of the gazetting hereof, cease to be provisional State forest, and shall become subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1924.

## AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT.

ALL those areas in Thames County containing together 15 acres 1 rood 3 perches, more or less, situated in Block XII, Tairua Survey District, being part of the area of 33,200 acres proclaimed provisional State forest by a notice in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 1920, page 924, being formerly parts of Whangamata No. 1 Block, and more particularly described as follows:

All that area bounded towards the north-east generally by Section 2, Block XII, Tairua Survey District, and a reserve along the foreshore of Whangamata Harbour; towards the south-east generally by the Whangamata Harbour, and towards the south-west and north-west generally by a public road.
