Notice under the National Savings Act, 1940, Section 4.

Wellington, 8th October, 1940.

IN terms of section 4 of the National Savings Act, 1940, I, Walter Nash, Minister of Finance, hereby prescribe that the first investment period shall run from the date of publication of this notice in the *Gazette* to the 30th June, 1941.

The rate of interest to be paid on investments made during such investment period shall be 3 per cent.

Moneys invested during such investment period by deposit in an investment account shall be repayable on the 30th day of June, 1945.

National Savings Bonds issued during such investment period shall be repayable five years after the date of issue thereof.
